Each year fires, insects, disease, lightning, and old age takes their toll on the trees within the Toiyabe National Forest at Mt. Charleston. As these trees die, some become important homes for wildlife. Others become a fuel resource for use by area residents.

Permits for the collection of firewood for personal use are now available. The firewood collection season runs from October 1 through December 31, 1986. Permits and information are available from the U.S. Forest Service at their office in the Charleston Office Park, 550 E. Charleston in Las Vegas, or by calling them at 388-6255.

Ex-Boxing Champ Michael Dokes Arrested on Narcotics Charges

Former World Boxing Association heavyweight champion Michael Dokes was arrested about noon Monday on narcotics charges.

Detectives, who executed

a search warrant on Dokes' residence at 4300 Coran Lane, confiscated 11 ounces of a white substance thought to be cocaine and \$6,500 in cash. Dokes, who is known for his combativeness, had to be subdued by four police officers.

28 year old Dokes was arrested on several narcotics

charges, including possession and conspiracy to distribute cocaine. He was also charged with resisting arrest and being under the influence of narcotics.

He was released later Monday after posting \$12,000 bond, police said.

Monday's arrest was not Dokes' first run-in with local

police. He was arrested June 14, 1982 on charges of battery with a deadly weapon and obstruction a police officer. The battery charge was later dropped and Dokes was fined \$100 on the obstruction charge in Municipal Court.

He was also convicted Nov. 2, 1982 on a charge of obstructing a police officer in an incident in which the boxer struck officer Rod Harris in the face.
