Black expected to be next U.S. ambassador

WASHINGTON-The Sen-Relations Foreign ate Committee is ready to recommend the Senate confirm Edward J. Perkins as first black U.S. ambassador to South Africa.

And he said he will, soon after his arrival, seek to meet with jailed black nationalist Nelson Mandela. leader whom Perkins called "a

player" in South African politics.

Perkins who recently has served as U.S. ambassador to Liberia, said he hopes the fact he is black will serve "as a small example to South Africa of how a nation's strength may rest on its diversity.

And he appeared to suggest that his race may help open doors to South African blacks, saying in his opening statement that he intends to "listen carefully to the views of South Africans inside and outside the government."

"I think the United States ought to be a facilitator (in dismantling of the apartheid process) if the South African want us," Perkins said.

He said he understands "there is some skepticism in the minds of South African blacks as to where we stand" in view of President Reagan's resistance to imposing sanctions by law.

'But I think we are now in a position to move beyond that," Perkins said. "I need to do everything I can do to tell South African blacks that America does care, that we stand for do their aspirations.




