Davis, who received his nickname from an early recording titled "Calling Dr. Jazz," dropped out of school early in New York and began emulating the lives of the club musicians he admired. taught himself He saxophone, drawing his aggressive sound from the likes of Ben Webster, Coleman Hawkins and Don Byas.

During his career, forged out of the sound he created in the 1940s and 1950s when he competed in the popular saxophone battles during the big band era, he played with an array of famed iazzmen and made several classic recordings.

In 1952, Davis began a longtime on and off relations with Count Basie Orchestra. playing with the band until The last ten years 1974 with the band, he served as both player and road manager.
