

NLV Declared "Marty Barrett Day"

The North Las Vegas City Council issued a proclamation declaring Wednesday, November 5, as "Marty Barrett Day," according to Mayor James Seastrand.

Marty was on hand immediately after the 7:00 p.m. ceremony in the North Las Vegas Council Chamber lobby to sign autographs.

Barrett is the second baseman for the Boston Red Sox who recently tied Billy Martin's record in game number six of the series for the most hits in a World Series game.

"Marty has brought great credit to the citizens of North Las Vegas and to Rancho High School," stated Mayor Seastrand. "It is gratifying to see such a fine young man achieve success in his chosen profession. We are all grateful for his example as a role model to our youth."

Barrett played shortstop and second base for Rancho High School in 1974 when they took the state championship. When Rancho won the state championship in 1976, Barrett was named the Most Valuable Player of the year.

Drafted by Boston in 1979, Marty Barrett was voted Most Valuable Player in the American League playoffs against the Angeles.

Rancho coaches Tom Coleman and Tex Anthony (now at Bonanza High School) attended the Wednesday evening City Council meeting to "retire" Marty's old uniform, appropriately number "1." The uniform was last worn by Barrett's brother, Tommy, who now plays for the Yankees.

Tyson To Receive "Fighter Of The Year" Honor at 20th Annual Fete In November

Undefeated heavyweight sensation Mike Tyson, who'll fight for the World Boxing Council championship later in November, will be honored as the "Fighter of the Year" at the Las Vegas Boxing Hall of Fame's 20th annual awards banquet Sunday, Nov. 16, at the Maxim Hotel and Casino.

Tyson, who has a record of 27-0 with 25 knockouts including 12 wins this year, joins a long list of illustrious fighters who have won the Las Vegas Boxing Hall of Fame's annual award including world middleweight champion Marvelous Marvin Hagler and former WBC and International Boxing Federation heavyweight champ Larry Holmes.

Tyson will be in attendance to receive the award as will the recipients of the "Man of the Year," "manager of the Year," "Amateur Boxer of the Year" and the newly created "Media Representative of the Year" honors.

The banquet begins at 8 p.m. in the second floor convention area of the Maxim. A no-host cocktail reception precedes at 7.

Tickets to the awards banquet cost \$20 with all proceeds going to the Las Vegas Boxing Hall of Fame, a non-profit organization. Attendance is limited to 350 persons.

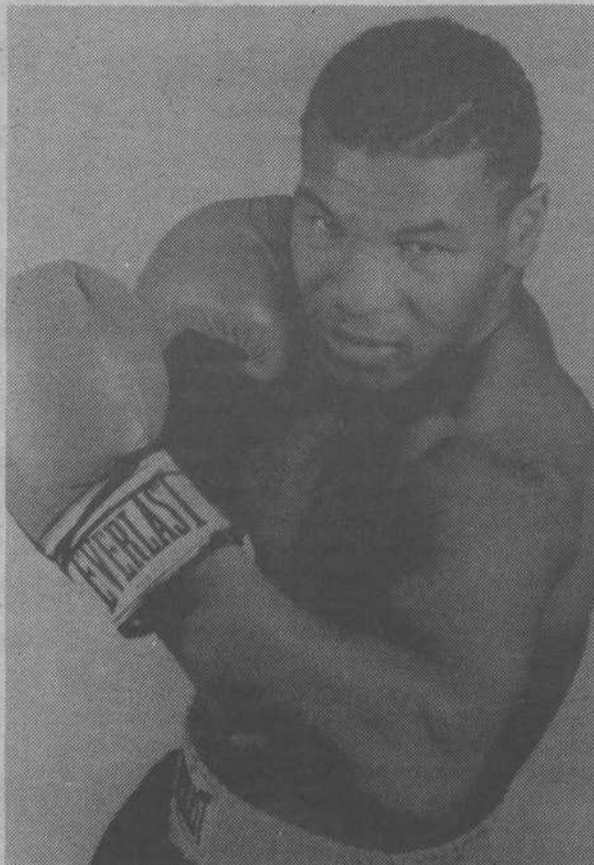
Tickets are now on sale 24 hours a day, seven days a week at the Maxim casino cage.

Las Vegas' internationally renowned ring announcer Chuck Hull will receive the "Man of the Year" award; Jimmy Jacobs and Bill Cayton, who handle Tyson, will be "Co-Managers of the Year," and Las Vegas John Tunstall will get the "Amateur Fighter of the Year" honor.

Other recipients of the "Fighter of the Year" award, in addition to Hagler in January of this year for his efforts in 1984 and Holmes in

1979, include Tommy Cordova in 1985, Roger Mayweather and Bruce Curry in 1984, Leroy Haley in 1983, Blaine Dickson in 1982 and Johnny Carter in 1981.

No. 1 Contender Matthew Hilton Added To Berbick-Tyson Title Card Nov. 22

Undefeated and No. 1 ranked 154-pounder Matthew Hilton of Montreal has been added to the Trevor Berbick-Mike Tyson World Boxing Council heavyweight championship card Nov. 22 at the Las Vegas Hilton.

The hard-hitting Hilton will face Franklin Owens of Oklahoma City in a 10-round bout.

Hilton has a record of 23-0 with 18 knockouts and is coming off a win over Cheto Ramos on June 13 in New York.

In his only other appearance in Las Vegas on April 19 at the Las Vegas Hilton on the undercard of the Michael Spinks-Larry Holmes International Boxing Federation heavyweight championship card, Hilton stopped Bruce Jackson in the sixth round.

Hilton's ranked No. 1 by the IBF, No. 2 by the World Boxing Association and No. 3 by the WBC. He boosted into those positions thanks to two impressive wins over former world champions. On Oct. 20, 1985, in Montreal he halted ex-world middleweight champ Vito Antuofermo in the fifth round and on Feb. 15 of this year in Montreal he pounded and eventually stopped former three-time world champion
