Southwest Gas Program Stresses Dangers of Hypothermia On Seniors

A program stressing the dangers of hypothermia and its impact on senior citizens is once again available from Southwest Gas.

Hypothermia, or low body temperature, is a critical national health program for millions of older Americans. While relatively cool indoor temperatures between 50 and 65 degrees produce some discomfort in most people, they can have particularly serve effects on the elderly, often leading to serious illness or death.

Through the use of a slide presentation, brochures, leaflets and group discussion, Southwest is attempting to educate senior citizens about this frequently misunderstood problem.

"Quite often the tell-tale signs of hypothermia are either overlooked or dismissed as simple disorientation or lack of coordination, and the condition is left untreated," said Marilyn Bollinger, manager of consumer affairs. "Our public education program identifies the warning signs of hypothermia and highlights preventative measures to combat this condition."

The hypothermia slide presentation is available for loan or showing to any interested civic or community organization by the company's Speakers Bureau and Consumer Affairs Department.
