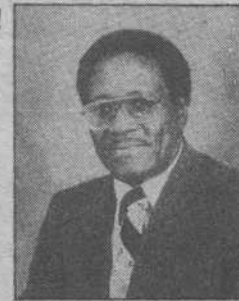

Jackson to run in 1988, 22 percent of whites concur and 63 percent of blacks and 6 percent of whites actually want him to win the Democratic presidential nomination.

According to other data from the JCPS, Jackson's appeal to the lower income and less educated had increased and his popularity in the Southern region has made him a political force to be taken seriously.

And, so, Jackson told the assembled press and his board of directors, that the American public was pleading for new leadership and "justice and humane priorities at home and peace through human rights and negotiations abroad."

He challenged the Democratic Party to make positive use of its new found power, by becoming issue oriented, establishing leadership and being sensitive to and responsible for political and economic advancement.
