Drainage Construction Begins On Carey Avenue

Clark County plans to begin construction of drainage facilities on Carey Avenue between Highland Avenue and Rancho Road on December 15, 1986.

The Carey Avenue Storm Drain project is scheduled for completion by August 1987 and consists of new storm drain pipe, drop inlets, manholes and related work in conjunction with a new sewer line for the City of North Las Vegas at a cost of \$2,030,291. This project is being funded through the 1981 Flood Bond Issue and Sewer Development Funding by the City of North Las Vegas.

Out of concern for the impact on residents and business, the Board of County Commissioners hopes to minimize public inconvenience due to construction by scheduling planned work in the area in five projects. The Carey Avenue Storm Drain is the first and will be followed by:

Smoke Ranch Storm Drain (Rancho to Cartier and Jones) April 1987--August 1987, Smoke Ranch Paving (Rancho to Jones) June 1987--November 1987, Jones Storm Drain (Cartier to Gowan) August 1987--October 1987, Jones Paving

Although duration of construction of all project segments will be spread over a sixteen (16) month time frame, the direct impact of total construction for both underground facilities and road reconstruction will result in minimizing direct and continuous construction for adjacent business and residents, in addition to the traveling public.

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King Capsule Proposed

The Martin Luther King Federal Holiday Commission recently announced that a Martin Luther King "Time Capsule" will be implanted in central Washington, D.C. in 1987 and will remain underground for 100 years. The capsule will contain selected memorabilia chosen by Mrs. Coretta Scott King, as well as photos, videos and audio tapes, film strips, speeches and sermons, depicting national historical events highlighting the work of Martin Luther King, Jr.

Brief audio statement by world and national leaders, historians, educators, children and working men and women on the life and legacy of Dr. King will be collected and included in the capsule.

The Time Capsule will also contain a miniature "Liberty Bell" on which will be inscribed the famous "Let Freedom Ring" passage

to accomplish." The task force is considering the coordination of two promotions during 1987.

from Dr. King's "I Have a Dream" speech. Through the magic of computer technology thousands of names will be laser-inscribed on the bell. These will all be unearthed and transcribed for the information of future generations. The Commission considers this a most unusual and appropriate perpetuation of

Martin Luther King's memory.
