

## Editorial Notes.

All of the many wonderful and thoughtful women associated with the National Council of Negro Women (NCNW)-and who also are associated directly or indirectly with the Assault On Illiteracy Program (AOIP) should be extremely proud. For, this month's story is most unusual in that it reflects how an old idea or "norm" in our society—the getting together of the family can be turned into a vital tool to help transform our brutally battered family semblances during long centuries of enslavement into solid structures on which our society can be rebuilt.

If we were only plain Americans like those of White or European ancestry, we could listen to such blissful words as "family reunion" with the same joy and pride as all others greeted by our glorious Lady Liberty, as they came to these shining shores as parts of often-poor, but always-proud families.

Yet, our memories, if true, could resort to no such resemblance. But many of us have tried to throw off the thoughts of our thorny past when we were terrorized and torn from the turf that was ours. In a culture in which tribal or family life towered over all, that close relationship simply was transcendent.

The realities of the tragic and often-deadly exploitation of our select transgressors were-and are-often so painful that, even today, many of us choose to see and believe only the brighter side of our past and present. And often, we need to look on the positive side of many otherwise perturbing things in order to build bright bridges from
