Health Notes

Influenza

Influenza occurs in epidemics, usually appearing in the winter or early spring. The highest incidence occurs among school children, but all age groups have influenza. The disease and its effects last a few weeks or longer.

_ Influenza is caused by viruses which have similar properties. biological However, the viruses are distinct and separate. The sources of infection are the respiratory secretions of infected persons. Following a one-to three-day incubation period-the period of time reventing appearance of the first sign of the disease--the signs of influenza are chills, fever, backache, headache, malaise, loss of appetite, and muscular aching. Although fever and muscular aching are the most prominent signs of influenza, the infected person also complains about a sore throat, fullness in the nose, and a cough. Other signs may weakness, pain or burning in Young Children sensation in the eyeballs nausea, nasal discharge and vomiting. Recovery from influenza is usually rapid. Some infected persons experience weakness for several days while others have a cough for two or three week period.

The number of serious complications from influenza is quite low. Among the less

serious but more frequent complications inflammations of the trachea, bronchi, sinus and middle ear. However, severe cases may be dangerous to infants or elderly persons, especially if they are already weakened by some chronic disease or condition. Influenza fatalities are not unknown.

Bed rest and medications which relieve pain and fever are the best treatments for influenza when the infected person has no complications. The most satisfactory means influenza vaccination. Persons receiving the vaccination may have tenderness, swelling, and redness at the place where the injection of the vaccination is made. The vaccination for influenza should be taken each year before this contagious disease is reported within the community.

Children need their primary (baby) teeth to chew food properly, to speak clearly, and to help preserve space in the jaw for permanent teeth.

Clean your child's teeth and gums with a washcloth or gauze pad after each feeding to prevent tooth decay.
