NNPA Stand Against Bigotry Tab Tops \$50,000

'HITE' O' THE NEWS:-The one thing that wasn't postponed this write 'round was my assignment to fill this space. The "Hite of the news" is when all of the tabs are in, with the tabulations of lost registration fees and corporate support dollars, the aborted '87 Mid-Winter Workshop of the National Newspaper Publishers' Ass'n, could cost the organization of the Black Press of America in excess of \$50,000. In the words of Christopher Bennet, NNPA's president, "It's a small price to pay in dramatizing a strong stand against bigotry highlighted insensitivity of Arizona's Gov. Evan Mecham. Though of Arizona's his attitude is untenable, come hell or high tide he isn't about to stay a preelection promise to rescind the state's recognition of the immortal Dr. Martin Luther King, Jr.'s holiday, Bennet and NNPA's board members on the scene gave Executive Director Steve Davis the word to furl the organization's flag and quit the scene. Bennett, publisher of the Seattle Medium and owner of one of the city's most successful radio stations, and board members, had high praise for the citizens of Phoenix who celebrated the historic second national b'day holiday inspite of the Governor's high handed decision rescinding it for the state. Also the Holiday In Convention Center management which did not attempt to dot every "I" to

block any and all escape clauses. It was a great time for the Black Press to flex its muscles...Congress sticking to its promise to take a sharper look into FCC regulations. and other b'casting rules covering the spotlight industry. Special attention will be paid to rules preferences minorities in the purchasing electronic media. According to a member of Rep. Cardiss Collis' staff, her office intends to make big waves about this. The Congresslady from Illnois kicked off her crusade in a letter to the editor of Add'Age in sharp terms. "I believe, she paragraphed, "that the Fed. gov. should not support business whose advertising expenditures lopsided. I will reintroduce the "Non-Discrimination in Advertising Act'' to deny such businesses a tax deduction for their advertising expenses. This legislation would allow an injured party to file a civil suit to recover damages by these practices. Excluding other minoritiy groups, questioned whether \$200-Billion plus annual spending power of this reflects advertising dollars directed towards it. In '84 national ad spending was \$88 billion. However, Afro-American magazines received less than 1.5%, just \$75 million. Radio stations received less than 1%-an estimated \$52million. For the period the precentages for TV and newspapers were so small
