

Fayetteville, N.C., near his home of Buies Creek, and former WBA heavyweight champion Mike Weaver on April 5 in Latham, N.Y.

Smith, who graduted from Shaw College in Raleigh, N.C., and then served in the United States Army. challenged Larry Holmes for the International Boxing heavyweight Federation championship on Nov. 9, 1984, in Las Vegas, finally falling in the 12th round.

This will be the sixth world championship fight to be held at the Las Vegas Hilton since December 1985, and the fourth in the heavyweight unification World Series.

Gates to the Las Vegas Hilton Outdoor Stadium open at 4 p.m. (PST) with the first bout starting at 4:30. The Tyson-Smith championship fight is scheduled to start at approximately 7:15.

The card will be televised by Home Box Office (HBO) but will be blacked out in the Las Vegas area unless there is a sellout in advance.
