already are sold out for the Tyson-James Mike "Bonecrusher" Smith World Boxing Council-World Boxing Association heavyweight championship unification bout Saturday, March 7, at the Las Vegas Hilton

Reserved seat tickets still remain in the other six price categories -- \$125, \$250, \$400, \$500, \$600 and \$750.

Tickets are on sale daily from 10 a.m. to 8 p.m. at the Las Vegas Hilton Special Events Ticket Office now located in the new Race and Sports SuperBook. Tickets also may be ordered from 9 a.m. to 5 p.m. by calling either (702) 732-5320 or 1-800-222-5361. Starting Feb. 23 the hours for both outlets expand to 9 a.m. to 9 p.m. These outlets are and will be open seven days a week.

Tickets in two prices resort hotel/casino. This is ranges -- \$75 and \$100 -- the first outdoor boxing card held at the Hilton in its nineyear involvement with the sport.

> The WBC-WBA unification card, promoted by Dynamic Duo Inc. and the Las Vegas Hilton, is the seventh in the eight-fight series designed to determine one champion in the heavyweight division.

> the WBC Tyson. in undefeated champion, with a record of 28-0 and 26 knockouts. This will be the 20-year-old's first fight since making boxing history by knocking out Trevor Berbick in November at the Las Vegas Hilton and becoming the youngest person to hold a world heavyweight title.

> Smith, the WBA champ, has a record of 19-5 with 14 knockouts. He, too, made boxing history in his most recent outing, becoming the first world heavyweight champion with a college degree when he stopped Tim Witherspoon in the first round in December in Madison Square Garden.





Also on the card will be a 10-round bout second heavyweights matching heavyweights Avery Rawls and Rufus 'Hurricane'' Hadley.




