"My dad arranged it," recalls Bill. "Dad was in vaudeville and worked with Blackbird Follies among others. He worked with some great talents including Duke Ellington and Louis Armstrong. When Louis came to Palo Alto, where we lived, dad fixed it so I could play. 'Satchmo'' was a tremendous entertainer. He really had charisma. I've never seen an audience warm up so fast; the response was instantaneous.

White attended Stanford University and Foothill College where he majored in and physical education. He was the first person to be elected president of the Foothill College Band. In addition, Bill played in the Stanford Band and Symphony Orchestra, the Peninsula Symphony and the San Francisco

of the prestigious President's Own United States Marine Band and served as director of the Marine's dance band.

After earning a M.A. degree in music, White became well-known in Southern California and in Las Vegas as a jazz tuba player. He played with Johnny Sincere, Eddy Peabody, JoAnn Castle, Big Tiny Little, Sammy Davis, Jr., Dinah Shore, Lou Rawls, Peggy Lee, Frankie Carr, Liberace, Don Cornell, Debbie Reynolds, Fay McKay, Rip Taylor and the Fifth Dimension.

Before joining the cast of "Legends in Concert" at the Imperial Palace, Bill played for several years in the popular "Mickey Finn Show" in Las Vegas.
