

The Las Vegas City Council Wednesday afternoon did what it called ''compromised'' on the renaming of Highland Drive to Martin Luther King Blvd. A disappointed group of Black citizens left the meeting without their request to rename Highland Drive after the slain civil rights leader. The Council elected to name only the predominately Black section of Highland Drive to Martin Luther King Blvd. The renamed section of the street extends from Bonanza Road North to Owens, where it meets the section of Highland Drive which has already been renamed Martin Luther King Blvd. by the City

of North Las Vegas recently However, from Bonanza south on Highland , it will be business as usual. The City Council voted to have this portion of the street remain as it has always been Highland Drive. The proposal as the Balck citizens had wanted it was defeated, it was alleged, because many of the white businessmen did not think it feasible to change the name (over a period of three to five years), due to the need it would entail to order new stationery, business cards and the like


