Dr. Eva C. Wanton, national president of Jack and Jill of America, Inc., called for a nation-wide celebration of

Black Family Day, May 2. Jack and Jill, a black family organization of 189 chapters and 40,000 families across the country, participated in decentralized festivities in every state. The organization's theme for this was "A National Agenda -Responding to the Crisis of the Black Family.

"We have encouraged our members to sponsor workshops and seminars to applaud our accomplishments and to address our challenges which are of crisis proportions," announced Dr. Wanton from her home base in Tallahassee, Florida. She enumerated teen pregnancies, school drop-outs, single-parent heads of households, drugs and black-on-black crime as 'disturbing problems threatening the very foundation of the Black Family.' To promote comradery and informal personal contact, Dr. Wanton suggested picnis, ethnic festivals, church services, Pan Hellenic activities among the many black sororities and fraternities

Dr. Wanton, who serves as dean of the School of General Studies at Florida A&M University, requested that President Reagan issue a national proclamation and urged members of the organization to persuade their governors and mayors to issue state and local proclamations, respectively.
