An Evening in Celebration of The Arts A Tribute to Duke Ellington

As cities across the country prepared festivities in honor of Duke Ellington's birthday on April 29, great artists and entertainers from across the country dedicated their time and talents to the first Annual Duke Ellington Memorial Humanitarian Awards held at the Church of Scientology's Fort Harrison Hotel in Clearwater, Florida.

"The awards should validate those individuals who dedicate their lives to the betterment of mankind. We want this event to take place year after year and to gain recognition on the level of the Pulitzer Prize," said Dennis Dubin, executive producer of the event.

The awardees and their related categories were: Tyrell Biggs-sports; Citizens Commission on Human Rights-human rights; Barbara Gardner Proctor-leadership; Dr. Leon Sullivan-religious freedom; and Grover Washington, Jr.-arts & music. In addition, McHenry Boatwright, world renown opera soloist,

received a special certificate for his contribution to the arts and Lloyd Remick, Philadelphia attorney, for his neverending battle against drug abuse.

Special guests included; Amanda Ambrose, Chic Corea, Jazz Musician; Honi Coles, Dancer; Hubert Laws, flutist: Mindi Lee, female vocal winner of Star Search; Paul Wagner, artist; Rev. Gensell, St. Peter's Church, New York; and the Glen Zottola-Bob Rosengarden Orchestra, featuring Bill Allred, Ted Bragin, Harold Danko, Norris Turney, Chris White, Snook Young and Bob Zottola.

The Duke Ellington Humanitarian Awards Committee (D.E.H.A.C.), spearheaded by Dennis Dubin and Ruth Ellington, was originally organized as a tribute to Duke Ellington's "Sacred Concerts." These were the music compositions that the "Duke" dedicated to the church, God, and religion during the year before his death. He performed these concerts at many

of the Cathedrals around the world with his performance at Westminister Abbey in London being the pinnacle.

He was described by Mr. Boatwright as a "very religious man and in the few months before he died, he took a sort of sabbatical and wrote the tone poems that later became known as the "Sacred Concerts." According to Mr. Boatwright, "he felt he had to take time to show how he felt about religion and that his religious music was the most important of his works."

Stephanie Berry, producer of the show, stated that "next year the event is scheduled to take place at St. Peter's Church in N.Y. and the year after at a church in Washington, D.C."
