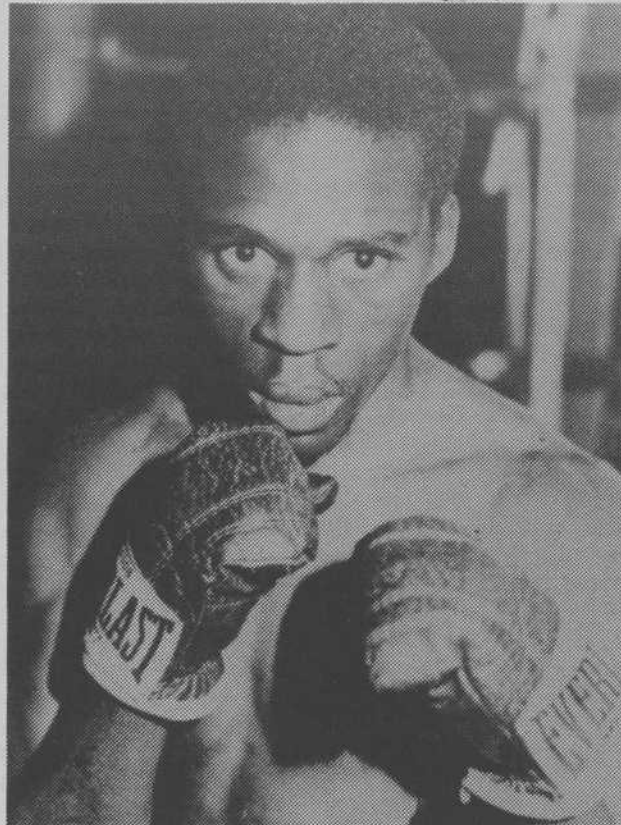

Mayweather won the WBA junior lightweight championship on Jan. 19, 1983, by halting Sammy Serrano in the eighth round. Mayweather defended successfully twice, stopping Jorge Alvarado in eighth and Benedicto Villablanca in the first at the Showboat, before being dethroned by Rocky Lockridge on Feb. 26, 1984. Mayweather failed in his effort to best WBC super featherweight champion Julio Cesar Chavez on July 7, 1985.

Davis has fought twice this year, beating John Montes on Jan. 12 in Reno and

Leone and with a record of 6-3-1 and four knockouts, meets Tom Covington of Phoenix who's coming off a shocking knockout win over previously undefeated Las Vegas KO artist Ed Duffy on April 20 at the Showboat.

Marino takes on Joel Gonzales of Los Angeles with a listed record of 0-2.

The 6-foot-5-inch Wright, from West Jordan, Utah, and trained by former world middleweight champion Gene Fullmer, has a record of 5-0 and four consecutive knockouts. His opponent will be determined by matchmaker Mel Greb.

Tyson-Thomas, Tucker-Douglas / Heavyweight World Championships / Set for May 30

Mike Tyson defends his World Boxing Association and World Boxing Council heavyweight championships against No. 1 contender Pinklon Thomas and undefeated Tony Tucker and James "Buster" Douglas meet for the vacant international Boxing Federation heavyweight title Saturday, May 30, at the Las Vegas Hilton.

This will be the first time that a fighter will defend two heavyweight championships in one bout since 1978 when Muhammad Ali did so against Leon Spinks at the Hilton.

The championship doubleheader, promoted by the Las Vegas Hilton and Don King Productions, will be held in the 14,600-seat Las Vegas Hilton Outdoor Stadium adjacent to the famed resort hotel/casino.

The card starts at 4:30 p.m. (PDT) with gates opening at 4.

The Tyson-Thomas and Tucker-Douglas title fights will be the eighth and ninth world championship bouts held at the Hilton since December, 1985, more than at any other site during this 18-month period.

Tyson will be making his first defense of the combined WBA-WBC crowns while Tucker, the IBF's No. 1 contender, and Douglas, that organization's No. 2 challenger, will be fighting for the championship left vacant when Michael Spinks was stripped of that title.

Tyson, at 20 years of age the youngest person to win a

heavyweight world championship, is from Catskill, N.Y., and has a record of 29-0 with 26 knockouts.

Thomas, 29, from Wyncotte, Pa., held the WBC heavyweight championship from mid-1984 to early 1986 and has a record of 29-1-1 with 24 knockouts.

The 28-year-old Tucker, at 6-foot-5-inches one of the taller heavyweights in the sport today, is from Houston and has the best record of anyone on the card at 34-0 with 29 knockouts.

Douglas, 27, is from Columbus, Ohio, and has a record of 23-3-1 with 15 knockouts.

Tyson won the WBC heavyweight championship Nov. 22 at the Hilton when he stopped and dethroned Trevor Berbick in the second round. Tyson added the WBA title in his most recent outing March 7 at the Hilton when he easily decisioned James "Bonecrusher" Smith.

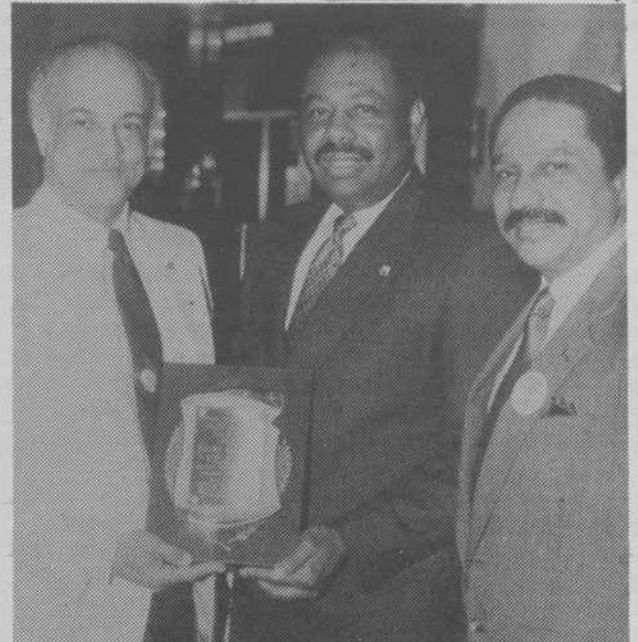
Thomas won the WBC heavyweight championship Aug. 31, 1985, decisioning Tim Witherspoon. Thomas successfully defended against former WBA heavyweight champion Mike Weaver June 16, 1985, halting him in the eighth round before being decisioned and upset by Berbick March 22, 1986. Thomas' most recent outing was on the March 7 card at the Hilton when he stopped Danny Sutton in the seventh round.
