"Now is certainly not the time in our history to turn back the clock on federal efforts to develop minority businesses that enhance our nation's industrial productivity and overall economic growth," Mitchell said. "It is imperative that Congress enact legislation grnting MBDA statutory authority to strengthen the agency's minority business develop-ment program." Such legislation would give MBDA stronger operating authority, far greater authority than the current presidential Executive Orders 11458 and 11625 which authorize the agency's operations.

MBDA has assisted minority firms to receive \$100 billion in financing, \$50 billion in U.S. government procurements, \$80 billion in state and local government procurements, and \$60 established 18 years ago.
