Los Angeles, California Cowboy Eighth In All-Time Coors Chute Out Winnings

GOLDEN, COLO. — Charles Sampson, a black bullrider from Los Angeles, California is eighth with \$6,000 in All-Time Coors Chute Out Money Winnings, according to the Professional Rodeo Cowboys Association (PRCA). These winnings were accumulated from 1982-1986 from year-end payouts only and does not include individual Coors rodeo bonuses, which push a cowboy's total Coors earnings significantly higher.

Charmayne James, a barrel racer from Clayton, New Mexico, is the leader on the All-Time Coors Chute Out Winners list with \$14,000.
