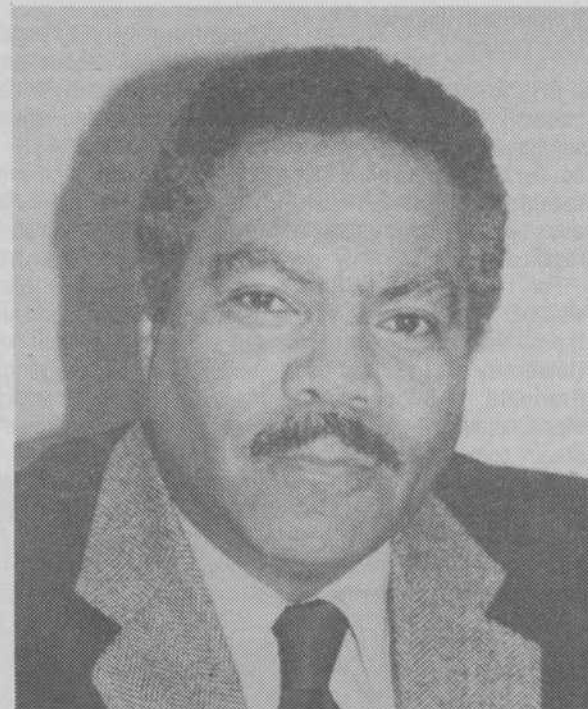
assist all members of our community in their efforts to participate in the economic mainstream. The Alliance is supported by local business member of the community as well as their membership.

New Animal License Fees In Effect

As of July 1, new Clark County animal license fees went into effect. These fees, as well as new impound and board fees, were approved on May 5, 1987 by the Board of County Commissioners as part of the Revised Title 10 Animal Control Ordinance. The fees, however, did not become effective until July 1.

The licensing of cats is a new requirement of the ordinance. Both dog and cat licenses will be issued to run concurrently with the rabies vaccination and expiring on the revaccination date of the dog or cat. Licenses can be purchased at the Dewey Animal Care Center or Black County Business License at 310 South Third Street, Las

Vegas, NV 89155.

The biannual license fee for a spayed or neutered dog is \$8.00, for unspayed or unneutered, the fee is \$20.00. The annual cat license is \$4.00 for a spayed or neutered animal and \$10.00 for one that is not.

The impound fee for dogs and cats has been increased

from \$5.00 to \$15.00. This increase will help to pay for costs of shelter services and encourage owners to keep their pets from running loose. Board fees for dogs and cats have gone from \$5.00 to \$6.50/day. This increase reflects the actual cost of daily maintenance fees for the animals' care.
