
Aaron served as spokesman for Arby's RBI 'Award program with Major League Baseball last year. This year his involvement with Arby's and BB/BSA will be devoted to special apDetroit-area franchises, developed a fund-raising coupon booklet for the Detroit area. The coupon books are being sold for one dollar in participating Arby's restaurants, with all proceeds going to Detroitarea BB/BSA chapters and to the Hank Aaron Scholarship Fund. This promotion will be supported by two television spots, two counter displays per store and a direct mail piece.

Another local option is a BB/BSA discount card. The card will provide discounts

for any big brother or sister volunteer and their little brother or sister when they visit an Arby's restaurant. Cards will be available in June, to be distributed through BB/BSA only.

The 1987-88 BB/BSA program serves as an extension of one begun last year when Arby's became a corporate sponsor of Major League Baseball. The fastfood chain created the RBI Award program, which honored the 1986 American and National League RBI (runs batted in) leaders, Schmidt of the Mike Philadelphia Phillies and Joe Carter of the Cleveland Indians. The award called the Hank Aaron Trophy, drew national attention to BB/B-SA, as the two were directly linked. For every run driven in by Schmidt and Carter, Arby's pledged \$1,000 to BB/BSA - a donation that totalled \$240,000 by season's end.

"The Hank Aaron Trophy, which honors Aaron for his achievements as a player, has already become a Big Brothers/Big Sisters. Arby's plans to make another contribution this year in the area of \$250,000," said Roberts. "In addition to the new scholarship program, which we hope to expand each year, we know that approximately 500 new matches will be made possible in 1987 because of the generosity of our franchisees. That means we can recruit and train enough big brothers and sisters to reach out to a lot of young people across the country.
