Rounding out the package of egostrenghening and motivational materials are the following:

1. The AOIP-participating Black community-building newspaper, which inserts *The ADVANCER* weekly, provides the needed role model reinforcement and other

types of uplifting news from the immediate environment. The teacher or tutor can still incorporate these most effectively even if the student is not yet on that reading level.

 The National BLACK MONITOR (which is inserted monthly) provides such reinforcement from a national perspective.
