REQUEST FOR PROPOSALS FOR ON-THE-JOB TRAINING SUPPORTIVE SERVICES

The State of Nevada Department of Transportation (NDOT) hereby solicits proposals for supportive services to increase its effectiveness in providing on-the-job training opportunities for minorities, women, handicapped and the disadvantaged on Federal-Aid highway projects.

1. A clear and complete statement of services to be provided under the contract such as services to construction contractors, sub-contractors and trainees, for recruitment, counseling, remedial educational training, assistance in the acquisition of tools, special equipment, transportation follow-up procedures, the experience of both the firm and individual personnel, etc. This statement must include numerical goals which the contractor intends to meet in the area of individuals contacted, tutored, tested, counseled, referred, placed into an approved training program and employed on Federal-Aid highway construction contracts. As a minimum it is expected that a goal of six trainees will be placed on Federal-Aid contracts. The proposal shall contain a monthly performance schedule towards achieving all numerical goals.

2. A program to keep track of trainees receiving training on Federal-Aid highway construction projects for up to six months, during periods when their training is interrupted. Also, conduct a six months follow-up review of the employment status of each graduate who completes an on-the-job training program on a Federal-Aid highway construction project. NDOT will furnish a list of those trainees that have completed the approved training program. The above requirements shall be fulfilled on a statewide basis.

3. The non-discrimination provision required by Title VI of the Civil Rights Act of 1964 as set forth in FHWA PR-1273 and a statement of non-discrimination in employment because of race, religion, national origin, sex or handicap.

4. Monthly reporting procedures containing sufficient statistical data and narrative content to enable Nevada DOT to evaluate both progress and problem areas. For example, the monthly report must contain contractor's progress in achieving goals noted in paragraph 1 and problem areas which would hinder meeting these goals. With respect to achieving the placement goal the monthly report must indicate the name of recruits placed, which training program and what project. A final report at the termination to

enable NDOT to evaluate contractor's achievement of goals, achievement of goals.

5. An itemized cost estimate. The cost breakdown must indicate the number of employees, position classification, race and sex, their salaries, amount of time, office location, working hours, expenses, etc.

6. The geographic area of coverage within the State of Nevada. Item (2) above, however, must be covered in the entire state. The proposal shall define the geographic areas of coverage for the northern or southern areas of the state.

Geographic area of coverage: southern area: all of the state of Nevada south of Highway 6. Northern area: all of the state north of Highway 6.

7. Additional Requirements — each proposal shall explain any funds being received from other Federal, State or private organizations. Such explanation shall include the following:

1. Purpose of funds;
 2. Amount of funds; and
 3. Agency from which funds are received.
- If it is a Federal contract provide:
- a. Detailed information on scope of work.
 - b. Cost accounting procedure to prevent duplicate payment for same work.

All proposals must adhere to the following stipulations:

- A. The contract will be for one year.
- B. The contract amount cannot exceed \$16,000.00 if the contractor elects to provide services in the southern area, or \$24,000.00 if the contractor elects to provide services in the northern area of the state.

At the present time, the NDOT is soliciting for proposals for Disadvantaged Business Enterprise (DBE) supportive services. The NDOT encourages all qualified contractors to submit separate proposals for DBE and OJT.

REQUEST FOR PROPOSALS FOR SMALL AND DISADVANTAGED BUSINESS ENTERPRISE (DBE) SUPPORTIVE SERVICES

The State of Nevada Department of Transportation (NDOT) is seeking the services of a professional organization to provide supportive services to Disadvantaged business firms interested in working on NDOT projects. We intend to contract for the services for a 12-month period beginning from the date of award.

Types of services to be provided for are as follows:

1. Training and technical assistance to otherwise qualified economically and socially disadvantaged businesses (DBE) for attaining a contracting license.
2. Solicitation and encouragement of economically and socially disadvantaged firms (DBE) to participate in all facets of NDOT contracting activity.
3. Assistance to such firms in obtaining financial assistance, bonding and prequalification.
4. Assistance to those firms in estimating and bidding.
5. Assistance to project management areas including scheduling, safety, labor compliance, etc.
6. Assistance to NDOT personnel in the utilization of disadvantaged business enterprises (DBE) in the major, minor and miscellaneous contracting areas.
7. On-site reviews of Certified DBE/WBE firms, applicants for certification in accordance with 49CFR 23.
8. Formally provide responses on findings and recommendations to NDOT concerning certification eligibility.

To be considered, proposals must contain methodology, experience in similar types of programs, estimate of cost, your firm's affirmative action plan commitments, provisions for maintaining a statewide DBE directory, provisions for certifying DBE in accordance with 49 CFR Part 23 Amended, specific numerical goals as to the numbers of DBE's licensed and the number of DBE contractors assisted in receiving Federal-Aid contracts and/or subcontracts and the present utilization of DBEs and females by your organization.

Monthly reporting procedures containing sufficient statistical data and narrative content to enable Nevada NDOT to evaluate both progress and problem areas. Sealed proposals for furnishing all labor, equipment, materials, and services required for the performance of entitled the work specified by Las Vegas Valley Water District Contract No. 467 "2860 Zone Pumping Station Discharge Pipeline" will be received at the office of the Clark County Purchasing Department, 10th Floor, Clark County Bridger Building, 225 Bridger Avenue, Las Vegas, Nevada 89155 up to and including 2:00 p.m. on Wednesday, September 2, 1987, at which time they will be publicly opened and read.

The site of work is located within Clark County and City of Las Vegas rights-of-way and easements from the Spring Mountain-Durango reservoir near the southwest corner of the Spring Mountain Road and Durango Road intersection and running westerly on Spring Mountain Road to El Capitan Way, northerly on El Capitan Way to West Desert Inn Road, and westerly on West Desert Inn Road to Crystal Water Way.

The work consists of the installation and approximately 2,220 horizontal linear feet of thirty-inch (30") pipeline including connections, valving and all appurtenances.

The Contractor shall be required to commence work under this contract within 30 calendar days after the date of the Notice to Proceed. All work under Contract No. 467 shall be completed by May 1, 1988.

Pursuant to Nevada Revised Statutes, Chapter 338, bidders are hereby notified that the prevailing wage rates established by the Nevada State Labor Commissioners must be paid to all workmen engaged in the performance of work on contracts awarded for the amount of \$100,000.00 or more. Said prevailing wage rates effective October 1, 1986, through September 30, 1987, as issued by the State of Nevada, Office of Labor Commissioner, and included in the contract specifications.

Prospective bidders must hold a valid license of a "Class" and a "Monetary Limit" corresponding to the work to be performed, in accordance with the provisions of the State of Nevada Contractor's License Law. Each proposal must be accompanied by a certified or Cashier's check or bid bond in the form shown in the proposal volume, in the amount of 10% of the total bid price as a guarantee that the bidder, if an award is made to him in accordance with the terms of the proposal, will promptly execute a contract in the required form, secure the required insurance and furnish the required bonds.
