Prep Football

After the first two weeks of the high school season one division showed domination of the other. The Sunset Division is now 10-0 against the Sunrise Division this year.

Rancho and Eldorado were supposed to surprise everyone this year but so far have done nothing but lose, along with Las Vegas, Western and Basic.

Game of the Week Nebraska v. UCLA

No. 2 Nebraska thrashed previously rated No. 3 UCLA this past Saturday. QB Steve Taylor threw for five touchdowns after shaking off a first quarter shoulder injury. The Nebraska defense ended Gaston Green's string of eight 100-yard games as the Cornhuskers won 42-33. Green, who had rushed for 1236 yards in his last eight games, scored three times on short runs, he was held to 46 yards on 19 carries. Nebraska remained the number two team in the country behind Big 8 foe Oklahoma. The two will clash later this year which

could prove to be a preview of the National Title.

Pro Football

Week 1 showed few surprises but then again there were those few games that stood out. The Cleveland Browns, LA Rams, SF 49ers, Seattle Seahawks and NY Giants are all supposed to contend for the Super Bowl. All five teams lost game 1 by a combined total score of 90-152. It could have proved to be a tough season after all. The game everyone focused on during week 1 was the NY Giants at the Chicago Bears. It was the best team of 1985 against number one of 1986.

With help from Mike Tomczak, the Bears defeated New York 34-19. Tomczak completed 20 of 34 passes for 292 yards and two touchdowns. The Chicago victory ended New York's 12-game winning streak that dated back to week 7 of the 1986 season. The Bears sacked the Giants 8 times for 53 yards. Phil Simms was brought down 7 times, then had to leave the game after being knocked groggy. Jeff Rutledge replaced Simms and went down once. It was the second straight defeat for the Giants on an opening Monday night game. New York lost to Dallas, 31-28, last year. The Giants have the rest of the season to defend their title.

Big games next week include: Pittsburgh at Cleveland, Minnesota at LA Rams, Dallas at NY Giants and New England at NY Jets on Monday night.

University of Nevada, Las Vegas, President Dr. Robert Maxson and Director of Intercollegiate Athletics Dr. Brad Rothermel today jointly announced the named of the first class of inductees to the UNLV Athletic Hall of Fame.

Sixteen individuals and two teams were selected in a program that has been over one year in the development.

The individual honorees are: Michael "Chub" Drakulich, Bill Ireland, Dr. Thomas Armour, Roger Barnson (posthumous), Bill Morris, Bob Florence, Glen Gondrezick, Don Lyons, Elbert Miller, Eddie Owens, Robert Smith, Ricky Sobers, Glen Carano, Nate Hawkins, Joe Intersoll and Mike Thomas.

The two teams to be inducted as a group are the 1968 Football Team and the 1976-77 Basketball Team.

"It is indeed a pleasure to announce the first UNLV Athletic Hall of Fame inductees," said Rothermel. "Our committees worked long and hard and I believe that they came up with a wonderful representative group of honorees for our Hall of Fame."

"On behalf of Dr. Maxson and myself, it is an honor to congratulate the inductees. Without a doubt, their induction is richly deserved," Rothermel added.

The formal induction ceremonies will be held on Friday, October 2 at the UNLV Hall of Fame dinner. The dinner and cocktail party will be held at the Moyer Student Union Ballroom on the UNLV campus. Tickets for the event are \$30 and reservations are available through the UNLV Athletic Ticket Office (739-FANS).

The inductees will be presented to the public at half-time of the UNLV vs. Nevada-Reno football game the following night so that the public, at large, will have the opportunity to recognize the recipients for their accomplishments.

All nominees for the UNLV Athletic Hall of Fame were required to meet nominee qualification requirements as set in the Hall of Fame charter which was approved by Max-

son this past summer.

A director or coach must have served at least 5 years at UNLV and must be separated from the athletic program for five years prior to consideration.

An athlete must have had a

10-year time lapse since his/her class graduated.
