Notre Dame 31 Michigan St. 8

Tim Brown returned two consecutive punts for touchdowns in the first quarter and totaled 275 all-purpose yards as Notre Dame overwhelmed Michigan St. The Irish, 2-0, ran up a 24-0 half-time lead on Brown's two touchdowns, two field goals by Ted Gradel and a pair of safeties. Spartan quarterback Bobby McAllister was sacked eight times, including one for a safety and another that forced a fumble that led to a Notre Dame touchdown. Michigan State finally scored with 1:06 left on McAllister's 57-yard pass play to Andre Rison and a two-point conversion pass to Bernard Wilson. The loss dropped Michigan State to 1-1.

## CLOVIS, NEW MEXICO COWBOY SECOND AFTER THREE QUARTERS OF COORS CHUTE OUT SEASON

GOLDEN, Colo.—Sylvester Mayfield, a black calf roper from Clovis, New Mexico, is in second place with 70.0 points after three quarters of the 1987 Coors Chute Out season, according to the Professional Rodeo Cowboys Association (PRCA).

This year, Coors will award a bonus to eight Chute Out champions, one in each event. In addition, Coors will award an additional bonus to the cowboy or cowgirl who accumulates the most points, regardless of event. Last year, bonuses were awarded to the top 12 point-winners, regardless of event. In previous years, Chute Out champs were awarded in every event, for a total of

eight Chute Out Champions every year.

"I think this new format will work out well for contestants," Don Sober, Coors Rodeo Manager, said. "Coors awards them for being the best in their event and also honors one cowboy or cowgirl for a superior accomplishment."

## TOP MIDDLEWEIGHTS VIE FOR IBF TITLE AT CAESARS PALACE OCTOBER 10

It's official. Contracts were signed today securing Caesars Palace as the venue for the Michael Olajide vs. Frank Tate International Boxing Federation middleweight championship fight on Saturday afternoon, October 10.

The announcement was made jointly by representatives from Madison Square Garden, Houston Boxing Association, Inc. and Caesars Palace in a New York press conference convened just minutes after the agreement had been reached.

"We've been trying for a long time to work out a joint effort with Madison Square Garden — a giant in sports events and certainly a giant in the world of boxing," said Caesars World President of Sports Bob Halloran. "We

at Caesars World are very pleased to have successfully put together what may be an unprecedented cooperative venture for two major boxing venues."

The scheduled 15-round contest, which has the two unbeaten fighters battling for the title formerly held by Marvelous Marvin Hagler, will be co-promoted by Madison Square Garden Boxing and the Houston Boxing Association, Inc., in association with Caesars Palace. It will be broadcast live (blacked out in Las Vegas) on NBC TV Network.

Scheduled just after the network's telecast of baseball's American League playoffs, the Olajide vs. Tate fight is expected to attract a huge
