## RAP—A Bright Star In The Fight Against Drugs

RAP is a brave and powerful educational and cultural program that's been operating for the past 17 years in the heart of Washington, D.C. Its students are not young school children, but men and women, black and white who have decided to put their lives back in order after a period of serious drug abuse.

Surprisingly, although RAP is nationally recognized as a drug free, drug rehabilitation program, its primary mission and activity is education.

"We are not a drug rehabilitation program," explains Ron Clark, RAP's founder and executive director. "We are an re-educational program which corrects a lot of the false information people get in American life. False information about drugs, about food, about how to relate to one another."

Indeed, when one actually visits the facility, the level of sophistication and commitment to education is impressive. There is a tape room where audio and video recordings are made of educational and issue oriented shows on radio and TV. There are cassette players or VCR's in each of the meeting rooms where a person can go and listen to these tapes. There is a classroom where teachers from the D.C. school system come in to teach the residents on a daily basis. There are posters and pictures throughout the building reminding all of black people who have made important contributions to society.

Beside the educational facilities, there is a kitchen and dining room, medical center, a partially computerized administrative center, a central control center which greets guests and monitors the daily activities and whereabouts of everyone in RAP. There are female and male dorms. It is very well organized.

A key part of the program is that all the residents take part in running the facility. This includes the kitchen, the administrative center, the medical center, everything. Thus their responsibility levels for both themselves and others is increased.

RAP grew out of the belief that despite the false claim of many psychologists and psychiatrists, their degrees do not make them the most effective in handling the problems of drug abuse. Indeed RAP is a living example that former drug abusers who have changed their own lives may be the best guides for someone coming off of drugs.
