A Black manufacturer of processed turkey products from Delano, California has been named as the 1987 Regional Minority Small Business Person of the Year.

The selection of Charles Herman Ellis, president of Ellis Poultry Processing, Incorporated, was announced today by Thomas Topuzes, Regional Administrator of the U.S. Small Business Administration (SBA). The award is given as part of the national celebration of Minority Enterrpise Development Week, October 4-9, which honors the significant contributions to our economy by more than

600,000 minority - owned businesses in this country.

Ellis was selected from among many other outstanding minority small business owners in Arizona, California, Hawaii, and Nevada. He will be one of 10 regional recipients who will be honored in Washington, D.C. on Wednesday October 7.

Ellis established his firm in 1970 with the help of two SBA loans. He was a participant in the SBA's 8(1) Program which provided him with the opportunity to become competitively successful in the federal contracts market as well as expanding

into the commercial sector. In his 17 years in business, his total sales have grown from \$283,099 in 1970 to \$6,399,949 in 1986.

Ellis credits the installation of 10,000 square foot freezer purchased with Business Development Expense funds provided by the SBA as the turning point in his business' success. "The cold storage facility allowed me to triple production," Ellis said.



A BEAUTIFUL SMILE IS AGELESS

Whether you are eight or eighty years old, a healthy smile is a powerful asset and there is no reason why you can't keep your natural teeth a lifetime. All too often, older people resign themselves to losing their teeth. If you follow a daily routine of property dental hygiene care, you can not only have a healthy smoke but you can also enjoy better eating.

Susceptibility to gum disease increases with age, and the disease attacks not only your gums but also the bones and tissues that hold your teeth in place.

To prevent gum disease and decay, the Southern Nevada Dental Hygienists' Association suggests the following dental hygiene tips for older persons:

—Remove plaque, a sticky colorless layer of bacteria that forms on teeth. Plaque is the major cause of gum disease and must be removed daily by proper brush-

ing and flossing. If plaque is not removed daily, it can harden into calculus (tartar), which may eventually promote gum disease.

If it is difficult to handle the toothbrush, there are a number of ways you can adapt the brush for more comfortable handling: insert the toothbrush into a rubber ball or sponge hair curler; or glue a bicycle handle grip onto the handle. An electric toothbrush may also be helpful if you cannot use a manual toothbrush. If floss is awkward to use, try a dental floss holder, available at most drug stores.

—Dentures should be brushed with a commercially prepared denture powder or paste, hand soap or baking soda.

-Eat well-balanced meals.

Have regular dental checks and follow your dental hygienist's advice on at-home care.
