"More people, doing all kinds of Gospel music, are being heard because of artists like Al Green and Tramaine," says James Bullard, General Manager of the Word Records Black Music Divi-

Bullard, who has spent more than 20 years in the Gospel music business, has made history by engineering the so-called crossover of these Black Gospel artists to the r&b charts.

"For the first time, we've got Gospel artists being played on urban contemporary radio stations while staying on the air in Gospel radio," says Bullard. "As a result, more people are hearing Gospel music than ever before and the sales of all of our Black recording artists

"It may come as a shock to some, but 65% of the recorded music sold by Word is Black," says Bullard. "Now, more than ever, Black Gospel is the backbone of the religious music industry.

Currently number one on the Gospel charts, Al Green's "Soul Survivor" album won Green two Grammies (Best Gospel album, Best Gospel single for "Goin' Away") and earned him airplay on r&b and pop stations everywhere. Tramaine's album, "Search Is Over" gathered her a Grammy nomination and her single "Fall Down" was a smash. Her new album, "Freedom" is due in stores shortly. Philip Bailey's "Triumph" album won a Grammy and yielded a hit extended mix of the single "Thank You."

The Mighty Clouds of Joy are cookin' with their hit album, "Catching On." The Richard Smallwood Singers are in the Top 10 with "Textures." The Clark Sisters are doing well with "Heart and Soul." Rev. Milton Brunson and the Thompson Community Singers are hot with two albums, "If I Be Lifted" in the Top 5 and "There Is Hope" still selling strongly.

Word's traditional Gospel artists are also no slouches. Shirley Caesar's "Celebration" album was nominated for a Grammy in '86 and "Her Very Best" is doing well and moving up the sales charts. Albertina Walker's "Spirit" album was nominated for a Grammy last year. Albertina and Shirley were nominated together for their single of "Jesus Is Mine."



Word Records Artists Bring Gospel To New Audiences

Part of the success is due to Word's distribution deal with A&M Records. Bullard once predicted that the Word/A&M deal would probably work more to the advantage of Black artists.

We have simply recognized that Gospel music is not as narrow a market as many people suppose. Gospel is deeply rooted in the fiber of the Black community. The church is our main institution and so Black Christians buy its music. The fact is, grandparents are not the only people who buy Gospel. The same people who buy Janet Jackson albums buy Tramaine's.

"No one should get the idea that we've compromised our Christian message to sell records," he continues. "All of our music is clearly and unquestionably about Jesus and true to our convictions."
