Soaring through the skies at close to 300 miles per hour, combining grace, dignity and ower are Team America, three Siai Marchette SF260's.



The Raiders lost their first game, to Denver 30-14, the Raiders are 3-1 while the Broncos raise their record to 2-1-1. Chicago remained the only undefeated team by thrashing the Minnesota Vikings 27-7. Dallas raised their record to 3-1 by defeating Philadelphia 41-

Blg games this week include: San Diego at L.A. Raiders, Washington at Dallas (Monday night), Miami at N.Y. Jets and Cleveland at Cincinnatti.

This year, the focus is on sports superstars, as well as entertainment greats, when the 3rd annual Arthur Ashe Celebrity Pro-Am Tennis Tournament is held at the newly constructed Hudson-Campbell Sports and Fitness Center in Gary, Indiana.

Organizer Carlos Tolliver said, "This year we want to feature the usual array of civic, social and entertainment personalities. But for an added twist, we particularly hope to attract Black Hall of Famers in baseball, football and basketball, as well as some of their contemporaries still playing the games.

The tournament is an annual fund-raiser for the National Civil Rights museum and Hall of Fame to be constructed in Gary, Indiana. Only last week, a telethon to benefit the project netted some \$947,000 in pledges and actual donations. The telethon - which featured Jerry Butler, Nancy Wilson, Ramsey Lewis and Thelma was broadcast Houston into some 10 million households across the nation via Black Entertainment Television (BET).

Mayor Richard G. Hatcher, national chairman of the board for the Museum and Hall of Fame, credited black newspapers and radio stations across the country for playing a major role in the success of the telethon. He added that the tennis tournament will be an opportunity for some of the greatest names in sports, entertainment, business and government to come together for an
