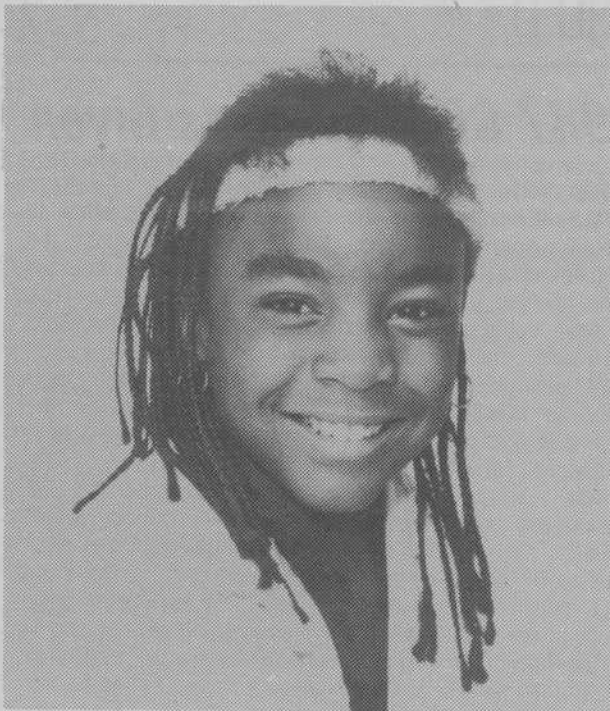


Milika Tiffany Shivers First Place Winner In the Crest Kids Scholarship Contest

ADULT EDUCATION PROGRAMS OFFERED FREE TO NON-GRADUATES

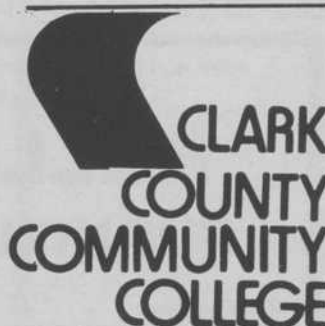
The Clark County School District offers instructional programs at no cost to persons 17 years of age or older who do not currently have a high school diploma. Adult Education Programs are offered in a variety of locations during daytime and evening hours.

Individual counseling, testing and credit evaluation regarding high school completion and vocational courses is available at the Career Development Center, 420 South 16th Street.

The Clark County Adult High School is an official G.E.D. (General Educational Development) Test Center in southern Nevada. This test is administered once each month (except July).

Adult candidates for a high school diploma, those 18 years of age or older, must complete 8 1/2 credits of required courses and 9 1/2 units of electives. Credits can also be transferred in from other accredited educational programs. Verified work experience and approved credit by exam meeting established standards may also qualify for credits.

During the 1986-87 school year, more than 400 adults graduated from high school through Adult Educational programs. For more information contact the Career Development Center, 799-8509.



LIFEPLANNING COMES TO NEVADA

Are you healthy? Happy? Wealthy? Loved? Sadly, many Americans are answering no to these important questions and according to author and television producer, Robb Dalton, these shortcomings can often-times be traced to a lack of goals in life and a plan of action to achieve them.

In an effort to help Nevadans in developing goals, Dalton is working with KVBC - Channel 3 in Las Vegas to share the television community outreach campaign, Lifeplanning. Lifeplanning is both a book and television campaign based on a series of unique self-assessment tests designed to help viewers determine how they are currently doing in the key areas of life: health, wealth, recreation, career and companionship.

Lifeplanning is the result of years of studying television research on the needs and opinions of the America public.

In Nevada, the Lifeplanning campaign is being developed for television by KVBC, Channel 3 and will be shared on their newscasts beginning Monday, October 26, 1987 and continue through Thanksgiving. Every weekday during the 6 p.m. newscast for the five week period viewers will have the opportunity to take the Lifeplanning tests. During 5 p.m. newscasts helpful advice from local experts will be shared and on the late newscasts, profiles and stories of Nevadans facing similar challenges will be featured.

Lifeplanning's first week's focus is health, followed by wealth, companionship, recreation and career. Area businesses are sponsoring the campaign with KVBC and underwriting the cost of the test brochures available free to the public.
