Lori Chapman trademark for as long as people can remember. "But now," said Chapman, whose lilting voice belies the power of her convictions, "it is time for me to put my theories to work in fashion."

Lori has put her advice to the test in the premiere issue of *L.C. And You* "fashion today and tomorrow." The new magazine is believed to be the first beauty and fashion publication aimed at the crossover market using people from all backgrounds and races. It is a quarterly publication focusing on fashion, beauty, health and lifestyles. In years of researching the feasibility of such a publication, "the experts" discouraged such a venture but Lori's vision was etched in technicolor, not black and white.

Fundings, loans and advertisers would not aid such a venture that was without



funds or personnel. So Lori wrote to friends and relatives to subscribe to her not-yet published magazine. Subscribers across the country answered her call.

With her faith in God and

the support of her friends, she worked day and night studying books on publishing, graphic arts, writing stories, laying out pages, etc., and *L.C. And You* was born.

es are sugar," she notes. Sugar contains four calories per gram. Chocolate items contains a large amount of fat and sugar and are more than double the calories with nine calories per gram.

"When making choices about candy, just remember that moderation is an important consideration," Harvey-webster advises.

thousands — are probably carrying the disease.

How do children get AIDS? In over three-quarters of all cases nationwide, the child was born with AIDS because its mother had the disease. Most of the mothers contracted AIDS through the use of intravenous drugs or from their sexual partners. Most of the rest of the children were exposed to the disease through exposure to blood or blood products, and a few were infected due to sexual abuse by a person carrying the disease.

Children who have AIDS deserve our compassion and help. Often their mothers are sick themselves, are poor, and do not live long after the child's birth. It is then difficult to find foster or adoptive care for infected infants, though there is every reason to believe that such care can

be safe if precautions are taken. Through our churches and community organizations we can provide help and support to afflicted children and families.
