### **CHURCH ANNIVERSARY HOSTED**

The 1987 Anniversary Program for Zion United Methodist Church will highlight seventy (70) years of the church's history and contributions to community life in Nevada. Friday Night, 7 p.m., Nov. 20: The service will consist of a "Celebration in Song" with music from the Women's Plus Choir and the Ambassador Choir of Zion. Special Guest Choir will be the Mass Choir of the Federated Choirs of Las Vegas.

Saturday, 7 p.m., November 21: Church Dedication Services will feature greetings, recognition and reminiscences of Former Ministers and/or their widows who have ministered at Zion during its vast history. There will also be a ceremony to dedicate and name several rooms in the Church Education Building after former ministers. A Fellowship Hour will follow these events.

Sunday, 11 a.m., November 22: Morning Worship Services will be conducted by the Rev. Robert W. Kelly, who served at Zion from 1949 to 1951. The Chancel Choir will render musical selections.

## American Gospel Music

Possibly the biggest news in Black Gospel music this year is the near tripling in size of the Malaco Records machine, which signals great growth in the Gospel music field.

"We're a little bit bigger than last year," says Malaco President Tommy Couch with a smile.

Malaco, of Jackson, Miss., is owned by Couch, Stewart Madison and Will Stevenson. Although Malaco already has many of the biggest names in Gospel, they chose to buy another major Gospel record company and a studio to add two full labels to their system.

The Malaco label features the music of The Williams Brothers, The Jackson Southernaires, The Florida Mass Choir, The Gospel Keynotes, The Sensational Nightingales, Louise Candy Davis, The Pilgrim Jubilees, Robert Blair and The Violinaires, The Truthettes and many others.

Most of these artists are produced for Malaco by the award-winning producer Frank Williams, eldest brother of the Williams Brothers and a member of the Jackson Southernaires. Among the albums under his direction currently riding high on the popularity charts are "Hand In Hand" by The Williams Brothers, "Hear Our Prayers, Oh Lord," by the Jackson Southernaires and "Live In Miami" by The Florida Mass Choir.

"Our artists are getting more exposure through television, radio and the Black press," says Williams. "Malaco's recording stars are reaching more people. As a result, I think that there's a growing audience for the kind of Southern, traditional Gospel we offer."

One would think that this was enough, but the mighty men of Malaco bought the huge Savoy Records of label of New York to grace their holdings. Giant, forty-year-old Savoy had been on rough times in recent years and had gone through a couple of owners. They immediately put long-time Savoy producer Rev. Milton Biggham in charge with a mandate to gear up for production.

"With our commmitment to excellence, we expect to see the

"With our commmitment to excellence, we expect to see the Savoy label regain its prestige and again be the leader in urban traditional Gospel. Our dark days are over," says Rev. Biggham. "The label has also added promotion man Sam Williams to help out."

#### Malaco Records Triples With Savoy and Muscle Shoals Labels

Among Savoy's current successes are "From The Ship" by Rev. Clay Evans and The Fellowship Choir, "Caught Up In The Rapture," by Bishop Jeff Banks and The Revival Temple Mass Choir and new releases by The Georgia Mass Choir, Donald Mulloy and The Jenkins Brothers.

But that still wasn't enough for Malaco. They also had to buy the world-famous Muscle Shoals Sound Studio of Sheffield, Ala. and open up the Muscle Shoals Gospel Sound label under the direction of Gospel pro Butch McGhee. Already on the album charts for this label are Vanessa Bell Armstrong ("Following Jesus") and Kelth Pringle("All ToYou").

"Muscle Shoals Gospel is primarily a contemporary Gospel label," says McGhee. "We have a more urban and pop sound and want to minister to non-Christians and Christians alike."

"We know we're gonna do good business," says Malaco's Couch of his three labels. "We're going from ten albums a year to 30 or 40. We believe the demand is there. "We don't expect any million sellers but then we wouldn't be surprised at success, either."
