

Free Medical Screening For Residents in Two Medically Underserved and Economically Depressed Mississippi Counties

TUNICA, Mississippi Residents in two of Mississippi' medically underserved and economically depressed counties, Tunica and Marshall, received free medical screening from doctors associated with the National Medical Association in November.

NMA, which represents nearly all of the country's 16,000 Black physicians, expected to screen 1,000 citizens in each county. This is the first time that NMA has sponsored a health screening program in Mississippi. The screening was sponsored by NMA and North Mississippi Rural Legal Services.

Explaining the purpose of the screening project, NMA's president, Dr. John E. Joyn-er, declares: "There is a great emphasis on hunger and poverty in the third world, but we do not seem to recognize and realize that we have these problems here at home. I am strongly concerned that we should be addressing our own needs much closer to us.'

"I want to make sure that we begin to address these (health) problems and dig in and do something concrete with the problems that we race, added the Indianapolis based neurosurgeon who was recently elected president of the NMA.

Poor medical services are commonplace in both communities. The counties do not have obstetrical or gynecological services. The lack of these services has created problems for women who must travel great distances

to have children. Poverty is also a serious matter. In Tunica, the poorest country in the nation, 52.9 percent of the residents have incomes below poverty level. In Marshall, 31.9 percent of the citizens have incomes below poverty level.

Health providers and community leaders from Tunica and Marshall counties met separately with representatives from the Department of Health and Human Services during the screening to discuss how to address health problems in both commun-

Tunica and Marshall citizens were screened for high blood pressure and hypertension, diabetes, and cholesterol level. They also received visual and auditory examinations.

The screening took place on November 21 in Tunica County and November 22 in Marshall County.

FAMILY REUNIONS: HOW TO PLAN YOURS


