Wooster wins third straight title

UNITAS, KILMER, PIEKOS TOP LIST A.F.A. HALL OF FAME NOMINEES

Former NFL greats Johnny Unitas and Billy Kilmer lead the list of inductees to the American Football Association's Hall of Fame in special ceremonies Dec. 18 at the Hacienda Hotel.

Unitas played semi-pro football with the Bloomfield Rams in Pittsburgh before he starred for the Baltimore Colts where his exploits gained him a berth in the NFL's Hall of Fame.

Kilmer was also an outstanding semi-pro gridder before he quarterbacked the Washington Redskins into the Super Bowl.

A Las Vegas bar owner, Tony Piekos, will be inducted into the AFA's Hall of Fame. His talent on the gridiron is still being talked about in the Midwest.

The AFA's Hall of Fame ceremonies is just part of a big weekend for past and present semi-pro football players.

On Dec. 19, at the Sam Boyd Silver Bowl, the 8th annual AFA Semi-Pro-Bowl championship will be decided when the two top teams from a field of 190 clash.

Kickoff is set for 1 p.m. The game is being co-produced by Las Vegas Events. Tickets are now on sale at Thomas and Mack Center and are priced at \$10 for adults and \$5 for children under 12 years of age.

The AFA Hall of Fame selection committee will honor other men for their dedicated service as coaches, executives, and pioneers, as well as those who spent limited time in the minor league ranks.

Guest speakers at the Hacienda event will be Hub Arkush, publisher of Pro Football Weekly, and Jim Foster, president of Arena Football Ltd. The public is invited to this event. Tickets are priced at \$30.00.

WILD HORSE ADOPTION TO BE HELD IN LAS VEGAS

Wild horses and burros rounded up on public lands in Nevada and California will be made available for adoption by qualified adopters December 5-9 by the Las Vegas District of the Bureau of Land Management (BLM).

The BLM will also give away a horse and a burro, during a drawing to be held as part of the National Finals Rodeo Downtown Hoedown, which will be held December 6, 1987, on Fremont Street.

About 60 horses and burros will be trucked to the BLM's temporary adoption corrals, which will be located on Las Vegas Boulevard, one block South of Tropicana Avenue, according to Ben Collins, Las Vegas BLM District Manager.

Adoptions will begin at 8:00 a.m. on all five days on a first-come, first served basis. BLM charges an adoption fee of \$125 per horse and \$75 per burro. These fees are used to help offset the costs of removing the animals from public lands and providing them with preliminary veterinary care.

The drawing for the wild horse and burro give away was made possible through a donation from Donrey Outdoor Inc. To enter the contest, fill out an entry form at the BLM Las Vegas District Office, 4765 W. Vegas Drive, or call BLM at (702) 388-6403, and an entry form and adoption information will be returned to you by mail. The lucky winners will be drawn on Sunday, December 6, 1987, at 7:30 p.m., at the Downtown Hoedown Center Stage, on Fremont Street. The winner must meet the BLM qualifications for adopting a horse or burro. "I think the drawing adds some excitement to the adoption

program," said Collins. "And I give Donrey Outdoor a special thank you for making it possible."

Over 69,000 wild horses and burros have been adopted since the program began in 1971. Once gentled and trained these horses have been used for roping, working, show classes, barrel racing, and personal pleasure riding. Burros can be trained for packing, and many have made excellent family pets.

People wishing to adopt one of these wild animals must be able to provide a corral or enclosure of planks, poles, or pipe materials at least six feet high. No barbed wire is permitted. Facilities will be checked prior to adoption.

Adopters must also have the means to support the animals; provide for transportation from the adoption site (ideally a 4-horse stock trailer, or a covered 2-horse trailer, with no drop gates); and bring a nylon web halter and a 20-foot, 1-inch-thick lead rope. BLM recommends that adopters have some experience in raising and training horses. However, if the adopter doesn't have a lot of experience in training horses, the BLM is offering a workshop on Saturday, November 21 at 10 a.m., in the Conference Room of the BLM Las Vegas District Office, located at 4765 West Vegas Drive. The workshop will offer tips on training and caring for wild horses and burros.

Applications for adopting a wild horse or burro can be obtained from the BLM's Las Vegas District Office or at the adoption. Further information on wild horse and burro adoption can be obtained from BLM at (702) 388-6403.
