

# TINA TURNER TO 'BREAK EVERY RULE' AT ALADDIN ON DEC. 10

A true superstar of the 1980s, Tina Turner's explosive comeback started with the Grammy-winning, multi-platinum album "Private Dancer." What followed was a triumphant world tour, a roomful of awards and a starring role in a major motion picture.

Long hailed as a potent sex symbol with the most exciting stage act in rock music, Tina followed up with an even more adventurous album, "Break Every Rule" and another world tour. Her "Break Every Rule World Tour" brings her to the 7,000-seat Aladdin Theatre For The Performing Arts for a Thursday, Dec. 10 concert. Tickets for the 8 p.m. show, which will be opened by very special guest stars Level 42, are available at the Aladdin Box Office and Ticketron outlets.

No stranger to Las Vegas from her Ike and Tina Turner Revue days, Tina will be back on the Strip that helped make her famous. Her "Proud Mary" days with Ike ended in 1975 when they split and Tina spent eight years working to get back on top. The break came in October, 1983, when her first Capitol Records single "Let's Stay Together" rocketed up the British charts then clicked in New York's dance clubs.

Its success almost took Tina by surprise and suddenly she needed an album — fast. "Private Dancer" was recorded during a pressure-packed two weeks with a patch-quilt of eight different songwriters and four producers. Tina's aggressive style held it all together.

"Private Dancer" was released in May 1984 and what followed was a rock apocalypse. The second single, "What's Love Got To Do With It?" vaulted to the top of the world's charts, giving Tina her first number one U.S. single exactly 24 years after she and Ike first entered the charts with "A Fool In Love." Follow-up singles

"Better Be Good To Me" and "Private Dancer" also cracked the top 10.

Rolling Stone magazine critics named "What's Love Got To Do With It?" The best single of 1984, and Tina was named woman singer of the year. Tina also won two American Music Awards and swept the Grammys with three awards.

The day "What's Love..." went to No. 1, Tina also learned she had won the co-starring role with Mel Gibson in "Mad Max Beyond Thunderdome." She has appeared as the Acid Queen in "Tommy" a decade earlier, but this was Tina's first chance to really act. Two more Turner hits were featured on the soundtrack: "We Don't Need Another Hero" and "One of the Living."

Tina joined more than 40 of the music world's top stars in 1985 to take part in the historic USA For Africa recording of "We Are The World" and also took the stage at Live Aid. In between, she played 70 sold-out concerts in Europe, a 105-date U.S. trek and a sold-out tour of Australia and Japan.

Following a well-earned break in early 1986, Tina recorded "Break, Every Rule," which produced the hit single "Typical Male" that peaked at No. 2 in October 1986.

In 1987, Tina took to the road for a second world tour. She played 14 countries, 45 cities, 96 shows and to 1,700,000 people on the European leg of the tour. Tina began the U.S. leg of the tour on Aug. 10 in Portland, Me., and the Aladdin date will be the 73rd out of 80 concerts.

After a brief rest, Tina will tour South America, Australia/New Zealand and Southeast Asia/Japan from January through March. That will cap literally a "world" tour.

Tina Turner has been making history for a long time, but as she often remarks: "I'm just getting started."
