## Express Mail Offers Hope For Last-Minute Shoppers, Mailers

You've waited until the last few days before Christmas and you want to be sure your present will arrive in time. What can you do?

Use the last-minute shoppers' and mailers' solution. It's called Express Mail Next Day Service, and it's available at the local post office.

"With Express Mail Service, customers can reach a large number of cities overnight," says Las Vegas Postmaster Joseph Ryan. "You can mail a package one day and have it reach the addressee by 3 P.M. the following day." Customers also have the option of having their Express Mail package available for claim at the destination post office by 10 A.M. the next business day.

Express Mail offers weekend and Christmas Day delivery to the addressee at no extra charge.

Items weighing up to 70 pounds can be sent by Express Mail. The service includes merchandise insurance coverage up to \$500 at no additional charge. Also, the sender can apply for a full refund of postage if a shipment is late.

the poinsettia outside for the summer, first in indirect, then direct sunlight.

- Prune the plant once more in July and increase water and fertilizer. Poinsettias flourish in high humidity.

- Move the plant indoors on Labor Day, but still provide at least six hours of bright light per day. Reduce water and fertilizer once new

the plant weekly so that each side receives light. Keep temperature between 62 and 65 degrees.

- Enjoy another holiday season with a beautifully bloomed poinsettia.

Poinsettias are not poisonous. The Consumer Product Safety Commission has pointed out that poinsettia bracts, like leaves of many other plants, may cause varying degrees of discomfort if



growth begins.

- From October 1 through mid-December, confine the poinsettia to darkness for 14 hours a day by putting it in a closet, basement or under a box. At the same time, give the plant 10 hours of bright, natural light. Rotate

eaten. The commission recommends placing plants out of the reach of small children and animals.

vote against the confirmation of Judge Robert Bork as an Associate Justice of the United States Supreme Court Don't let anyone tell you otherwise — there is power in your vote. When you fail or refuse to register and vote or encourage your family members or friends to register and vote on election day, then you are really saying, unlike your relatives back home in the South, that you don't care. You don't care about the present or future of your wife or husband, children or grandchildren, uncles or aunts, cousins, nephews or nieces or anyone else, not even Martin Luther King, Jr., Medger Evers, Rev. & Mrs. Harry Moore, the three little girls in Alabama and scores of others who died for your right to vote. What is your excuse for not registering and voting?

Then why don't you give yourself a second present for Christmas? This present won't cost you anything but a little time. You can register at the NAACP office every Tuesday night at 7:00 p.m.
