

Geniveva Andrade Shot to Death Health Fair '88

Funeral services were held Tuesday evening for well-known business woman, Geniveva Andrade, 41, who was shot to death in the apartment where she lived on February 24.

She was killed by Mounir Marrouche, 65, the estranged husband of her roommate, Linda Marrouche, age 37.

According to Las Vegas police, the man, who was in the midst of divorce proceedings, shot and killed Andrade and his wife, and then turned the gun on himself, in what was called a domestic dispute.

Both women were shot in the head and the chest and died immediately. Marrouche, after being transported to University Medical Center, died of a gunshot wound in the head a short time later.

Andrade, recognized as a

business entrepreneur, was the former co-owner of D & G Enterprises, Inc., an advertising, printing and public relations firm.

Originally from Massachusetts, she is survived by her

parents and other family members and friends there and by a daughter, Kim and a grandchild and a host of friends here in Las Vegas.

Interment will take place in Massachusetts.

During the month of March, free health screenings will be provided to residents of Las Vegas, Henderson and Boulder City at various locations throughout Southern Nevada (please see schedule below).

The Health Fair will provide 13 free medical screenings: height, weight, blood pressure, EKG, pulmonary functions, visual acuity, glaucoma, hearing, skin cancer, oral cancer, exercise education, foot screening, and a health risk appraisal.

No blood tests will be administered at Health Fair this year, but the public will have the opportunity to receive optional laboratory tests at a reduced cost. The tests include urinalysis, blood count,

basic blood chemistry, and a coronary risk profile. Those interested in taking the tests may pay for them at Health Fair, then have the procedure administered at a designated testing center.

"Health Fair serves a dual purpose; to provide health screenings for those who might not otherwise have received them, and to increase the individual's awareness of their responsibility for their own health care," said KTNV's General Manager Jim Behling.

Health Fair is being co-sponsored by major Southern Nevada hospitals, including University Medical Center, Boulder City Hospital, St. Rose de Lima Hospital, Humana Hospital Sunrise, Community Hospital and Desert Springs.

The minister-politician may benefit — or suffer from the "crossover" vote of conservative white Democrats who are switching votes in open primary states (without declaring party preference) to support Republicans — or vice-versa, Tennessee Sen. Albert Gore, leaving Gephardt and Illinois Sen. Paul Simon to split the remaining white vote with Jackson as he maintains a majority of black votes. "This is the new southern strategy in reverse," said one observer.

However, not all black voters are locked into the Jackson camp. Although 18 of the 23 Congressional Black Caucus members have pledged support, some black leaders, such as Rep. Alan Wheat (D-Kansas City) have a mixed constituency who favor Gephardt.

Jackson has drastically changed his strategy since 1984. Now, most of his top campaign positions are held by white political professionals, including the campaign manager, communications directors, press secretary, and an Asian director of field operations. "We have Blacks, Browns and Whites according to our Rainbow Platform, as we seek broader support," declared Daniels. "We can't win with exclusive black voters. There is a lot of talent out there and they want to help," he added.

And big city black mayors Coleman Young, Detroit; Thomas Bradley, Los Angeles; Sidney Bathelemy, New Orleans, and Chicago's new mayor, Eugene Sawyer, as well as convention host, Atlanta Mayor Andrew Young, who has not endorsed former colleague Jackson, may control the deciding votes, along with Washington, D.C. Mayor, Marion Barry and Rep. Walter E. Fauntroy, who are helping to mastermind the Jackson strategy.

NEW NATIONAL BLACK BEAUTY PAGEANT SET FOR WASHINGTON

America will soon have its second major national Black beauty and talent pageant. Organizers announced last week that the First Annual Miss Black USA Beauty Pageant has been set for November 19, 1988 in Washington, D.C.

Executive Director Robert N. Taylor told a news conference, "Our aim is to promote Black beauty while simultaneously aiding young, talented women with scholarships and cash awards." Taylor denied reports that the Miss Black USA Pageant would be in conflict with the 20-year-old Miss Black America Pageant.

According to Taylor, "What we are offering is healthy competition which in the final analysis will be beneficial to us all."

The Miss Black USA Pageant will be organized on a

city-wide basis with contestants from up to 100 cities expected to compete in the national competition. Already, local sponsors have begun organizing in approximately 20 major cities.

Persons or organizations wishing to sponsor pageants in their cities or counties have been asked to send for a free information packet from the Miss Black USA Pageant, c/o Law-Tay Communications, 1377 K Street, NW, #98, Washington, D.C. 20005. All local pageants are expected to take place between July 1 and October 1.

The coordinator of the national pageant will be Libby Lawson, a former beauty pageant winner and daughter of former Fisk University President James Lawson.

According to Ms. Lawson, "One of the special attractions of this pageant is that we will help local sponsors organize contests which will be both financially rewarding to themselves and to the contestants."
