

## Westside School Alumni Search Continues

This is the third in a series of profiles of alumni of the Westside School who attended or worked at the school between 1922 and 1969. **Dr. Agnes Lockett**—Dr. Lockett's first teaching assignment in Nevada was at the Westside School, where she taught from 1957 to 1967. She then joined the staff at UN Las Vegas, where she taught, and was awarded the Distinguished Professor for the College of Education in 1984.

Dr. Lockett also attended the University of Arizona, and Albany State College in Albany, Georgia. She is the mother of two children. Now retired, she lives in Boulder City, Nevada with her husband Emery, who is also a retired engineer from the U.S. Bureau of Reclamation in Boulder City.

**Mrs. Ruth Fyfe** — Mrs. Fyfe was a teaching principal at the Westside School from 1928-1935, when the facility was a two-room plant, and Fyfe taught second grade, long with her administrative duties. Fyfe, now retired, has a school in Clark County named after her. It is called the Ruth Fyfe Elementary School.

**Betty Scott-Henderson**—Betty Henderson, an alumna of the Westside School, is also the Association's president, and one of the charter members. Henderson received her Juris Doctorate Degree of Law in 1982 from Armstrong Law School in Berkeley, Calif. She was the first Black female hired as a

deputy sheriff by the Clark County's Sheriff's Department, and while living and attending school in Northern California, she served as Executive Assistant to the President/CEO for Children's Hospital Foundation in Oakland, Calif. She was the first Black appointed as Association Chairman for the San Francisco Bay Boy Scout Council, and presently serves as Service Unit Director. Trainer/Consultant for the Frontier Girl Scout Council in Las Vegas. Henderson, a member of the Las Vegas Chapter of the National Bar Association, has received many awards, including the 1983 National Woman of the Year Council of Negro Women, East Bay Chapter. She is presently employed as a Deputy Clerk for the U.S. Bankruptcy Court in Las Vegas. Henderson is the mother of two daughters and one son.

**Lucille Hughes**—Mrs. Hughes, her late husband, and two sons moved to Las Vegas from Alabama during the construction of Boulder (Hoover) Dam. In the early 1930s they provided food and lodging for workers at the dam site, and later founded the Hughes Grocery Store in the 500 Block of West Jackson Avenue, now the site of the Hughes Liquor Store and the Hughes Apartments and Business Complex. Hughes served two terms as president of the Westside School PTA, and assisted with the organization of Boy Scout Troops at the Westside School. Hughes has received many awards and citations for her community and church work in Clark County and Las Vegas. She is the mother of two sons, Nathaniel and Johnny. All three are in-

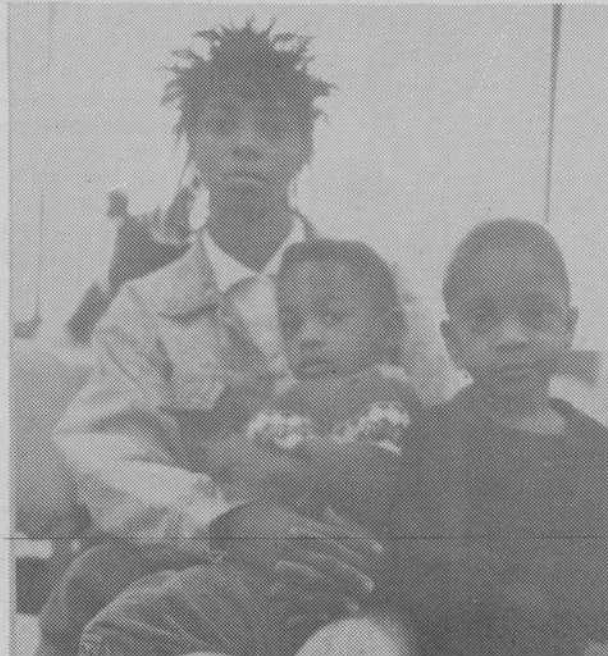
## EOB HEALTH SERVICES DIVISION OPENS


THEREFORE, we, the Board of City Council of the City of Las Vegas, Nevada, do hereby proclaim the month of April, 1988 to be:


"FAIR HOUSING MONTH"


