BILBRAY MEETS ON SANCTIONS AGAINST RACIST SOUTH AFRICAN GOVERNMENT

WASHINGTON—Congressman James Bilbray (D-NV) met with other members of the House Subcommittee on Africa to discuss economic sanctions against the government of South Africa.

Bilbray later discussed the issue with Congressman Ron Dellums (D-CA) who has introduced sanctions legislation, and Rep. Wolpe, Chairman of the Subcommittee.

"The time has come for South Africa's policy of apartheid to end," said Bilbray, "and the subcommittee is studying ways to force such a policy change."

ity Affairs Spokesperson Ruby A. Garland. Following an explanation and discussion of the purposes and objectives of AARP, the group concluded that a local chapter in West Las Vegas was not only feasible but highly desirable. The name chosen at the time was the Northwest AARP Chapter.

JEFFERSON TOWN MEETING SET FOR APRIL 29-30

More than 150 Las Vegas are expected to attend a two-day meeting to discuss constitutional issues April 29

and 30 at UNLVs Beam Hall.

The Greater Las Vegas Jefferson Meeting is being held in honor of the bicentennial of the U.S. Constitution and is sponsored by the National Conference of Christians and Jews with grants from The Jefferson Foundation, The National Conference of Christians and Jews and the Nevada Bicentennial Commission.

The forum is designed to recreate the atmosphere of meetings 200 years ago when a group of Americans gathered in Philadelphia to design a new government.

The program will begin at 6:15 p.m. April 29 with a reception and keynote address by U.S. District Judge Lloyd George. The 150 selected delegates will then divide into their respective issue committee groups. The next day all delegates will return and debate pro and con of each constitutional issue. Some of the issues to be debated include the role of money in political elections, the length of the president's term of office and the role of the

judiciary and the constitution.

The goal of the Jefferson Town Meeting is to increase citizen's awareness of the constitution and thereby strengthen the constitutional system in the United States.

cereal, milk, formula and juices and other items.

Located at 5701 Missouri, the new clinic will operate out of the community center building at Biegger Estates Housing Complex. The site was selected because of its convenience to East Las Vegas residents who are not presently served by a local area clinic. Public bus transportation is available along Boulder Highway on Las Vegas transit line no. 11.

The Economic Opportunity Board of Clark County (EOB) is the largest provider of WIC services in Nevada. This new clinic in East Las Vegas will expand total service to 4380 patients receiving WIC benefits.

Presently, EOB operates three (3) clinics: located in Henderson on Major Street, in North Las Vegas on Tonopah, and in Las Vegas on Comstock.

Expecting mothers, or mothers with children wishing to enroll in the WIC Program must be low-income and residents of Clark County. The new clinic is open Monday thru Friday, 8 a.m. to 5 p.m., and services are by appointment only. For more information call 451
