

cereal, milk, formula and juices and other items.

Located at 5701 Missouri. the new clinic will operate out of the community center building at Biegger Estates Housing Complex. The site was selected because of its convenience to East Las Vegas residents who are not presently served by a local area clinic. Public bus transportation is available along Boulder Highway on Las Vegas transit line no. 11.

The Economic Opportunity Board of Clark County (EOB) is the largest provider of WIC services in Nevada. This new clinic in East Las Vegas will expand total service to 4380 patients receiving WIC benefits.

Presently, EOB operates three (3) clinics: located in Henderson on Major Street. in North Las Vegas on Tonopah, and in Las Vegas on Comstock.

Expecting mothers. or mothers with children wishing to enroll in the WIC Program must be low-income and residents of Clark County. The new clinic is open Monday thru Friday. 8 a.m. to 5 p.m., and services are by appointment only For more information call 451
