

also called upon to assist with numerous cases of unsolved murders of Native Americans and African Americans, some even involving the local police.

However, Julian Pierce was not only involved in the law; rather, he participated in the entire life of his community. He was instrumental in organizing and served as chairman of the Robeson County Health Corporation which operated medical clinics in three RObeson County towns. He also served as chairman and chief fundraiser for an ongoing outdoor play which dramatically exposes the oppression of the Lumbee community while reinforcing the beauty and strength of their culture. The unceasing energy, commitment and brilliance of Julian Pierce touched all segments of the Lumbee community.

Yes, Julian Pierce was a powerful force in his community. Dexter Locklear, his campaign aide, emphasized this when he said, "[Julian's death] is going to rally people together. This will make the Indian people stronger.

The time has come when all Americans must stand together against all forms of racial injustice. The continued oppression of Native Americans-one of the gravest examples of racial injustice-must be challenged until the victory of freedom and justice is won.
