He served as Vice-Chairman of the Elections Committee and passed legislation that require counties to establish polling places in residential developments that house senior citizens. Assemblyman Williams was also a member of the Economic De-

velopment, Health and Welfare and Labor and Management Committees.

Williams stated that the reason he seeks re-election is to "expand the agenda of improving the posture of District 6 among the political arenas of Nevada politics. Though I'm proud of my record, there is still much to be

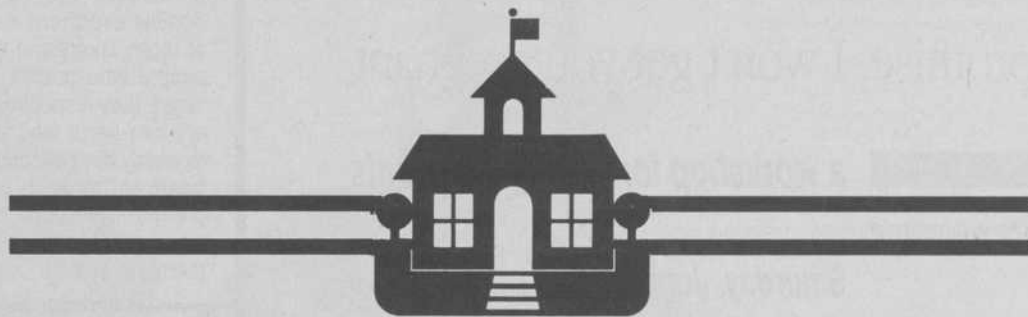
