

## Rebel Hall of Fame Nominations Sought

Nominations are currently being accepted for the second class of inductees to the UNLV Athletic Hall of Fame. Nomination forms are available through the UNLV Sports Information Office (739-3207). Deadline for the 1988 nominees is July 1.

Nominee qualifications include:

### ATHLETE

- Must be a documented athletic letterwinner.
- May be nominated by anyone willing to substantiate his/her nomination.
- Must be a 10-year time lapse since the candidate's class graduated.

- While athletic achievement as an undergraduate is of prime importance, outstanding accomplishments after leaving UNLV will also serve as a factor in making the selection.

- Alumni athletes while serving with the Hall of Fame Selection Committee may not be considered for induction.

### COACHES, ATHLETIC OFFICIALS or UNIVERSITY ADMINISTRATORS

- Must have had an outstanding career at UNLV which resulted in a direct and significant impact on UNLV athletics for at least five years.

- Must have terminated his/her services with the UNLV athletic department at least five years prior to his/her induction.

- After the charter year there shall be only one person eligible each year for induction into the Athletic Hall of Fame under this category unless for good cause, this provision is waived by a unanimous vote of the Selection Committee.

### ATHLETIC TEAMS

- An athletic team shall be eligible for induction as one inductee.

- The induction of a team shall not prohibit the separate induction of one or more of its members.

- When a team is inducted, the Selection Committee shall select a representative to accept the award.

### OTHERS

- Others may be considered who have made exceptional contributions of time and effort to UNLV athletics.

This year's class of inductees will be honored on Friday, September 23, 1988 at the annual Hall of Fame Dinner and Induction Ceremonies, as well as at the UNLV vs. Ohio University football game on September 24.

Last fall, UNLV inducted

its first class of members into the Athletic Hall of Fame. Those inductees included: The 1968 UNLV Football Team, the 1976-77 UNLV Basketball Team; Administrators, Directors and Coaches: Michael "Chub" Drakulich, and Bill Ireland; Administrators/Staff: Dr. Thomas Armour and Roger Barnson; Booster Bill "Wildcat" Morris; Basketball Players: Bob Florence, Glen Gondrezick, Don Lyons, Elbert Miller, Eddie Owens, Robert Smith and Ricky Sobers; Football Players: Glen Carano, Nate Hawkins, Joe Ingersoll, and Mike Thomas.

Of course, quibbling about Kareem's scoring at this point in his career is like complaining about the mileage your Porsche gets. The memories of one of the game's greatest players of all time far outweigh the slowing down that age brings to all of us, and especially to one whose exploits throughout the years have been on a level that only a few players have even come close to equaling.

Kareem's scoring, although consistent, doesn't begin to compare with Wilt Chamberlain, who averaged 50 points a game for an entire season and in one game scored 100 points. His NBA titles, as many as they have been, pale when compared to those collected by Bill Russell.

But those are the only centers with whom to compare Kareem. And that's rarefied company indeed.

## AQUINO TAKES ON DESTROYIN' ROYAN HAMMOND FOR VACANT NABF CHAMPIONSHIP ON FRIDAY, AT CAESARS PALACE

Lupe Aquino, coming off one of his biggest victories—knocking down and decisioning Milton McCrory—takes on rugged Destroyin' Royan Hammond in a 12-round bout

for the vacant North American Boxing Federation (NABF) super welterweight championship here at Caesars Palace on Friday, June 24.

Aquino, 25, has a ring record of 32-4-1 with 22 knockouts. He is from Santa Paula, Calif. Hammond, 26, fights out of Vallejo, Calif., and is coming off his finest effort, shocking NABF welterweight champion Luis Santana with a 10-round split decision victory in Las Vegas on March 12. Hammond has a record of 16-0 with seven knockouts.

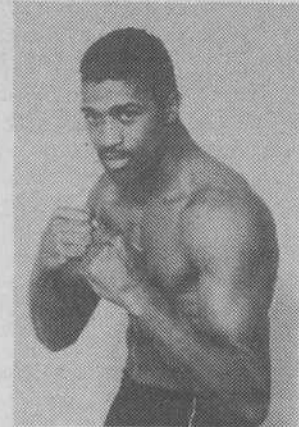
It is a particularly important fight for Aquino, who will put his ratings—WBC 3, IBF 8—at stake when he faces Hammond. Aquino captured the World Boxing Council super welterweight championship on July 12, 1987 in Bordeaux, France. There Aquino decked champion Duane Thomas of Detroit in the second round, hurt him in the 10th and 11th, then floored him again in the 12th en route to an easy decision victory.

Aquino lost the WBC belt in his first defense, losing by decision to Gianfranco Rosi. However, this past April, Aquino scored his big victory over McCrory, knocking the former world champion down twice and winning a stunning 95-92, 94-93, 94-94 majority 10-round victory.

Hammond was a two-to-one underdog when he took on the veteran Luis Santana in Las Vegas. Hammond started out strong, was hurt in the third and fourth rounds, but battled back gamely to score his split-

decision victory. Hammond won on two scorecards, 97-92, 95-93; Santana was ahead on the other, 95-93.

Also scheduled to appear is Akeem Anifowoshe, the Las Vegas bantamweight who has a record of 9-0 with six knockouts. Anifowoshe last fought May 21 in

Las Vegas and stopped Romy Gary in an eight-round decision. Anifowoshe will box in an eight-round bout against an opponent to be named.

A total of six bouts are scheduled. First bell is at 6 p.m. in the Caesars Palace Sports Pavilion.

The Tyson/Spinks fight may be taking place in Atlantic City, but fight fans in Las Vegas will get a chance to see the match-up live and almost as well as those paying megadollars to be a part of the action on the east coast in the Aladdin's Theatre for the Performing Arts.

The Monday evening, June 27 event can be seen in the comfortable setting of the Aladdin's Theatre for the Performing Arts for just \$30 per person, which is the least expensive ticket in Las Vegas.
