
Officiating Basketball **Camps at Doolittle Community Center**

the Showboat.

Johnson, a 21-year-old college student, has scored knockouts in five of his past six wins.

Guy is part of the Dave Gorman stable that has produced three world chamipions: former world welterweight and current World Boxing Council super welterweight champ Donald Curry, former WBA junior welterweight champ GENE Hatcher and former WBA featherweight champ Steve Cruz.

Injuries have allowed Guy to fight only once in the past months. He stopped Uriel Martinez in the fourth round on July 28, 1987, but then injured his back while working in the service department of a new car dealership. Guy returned on Feb. 23 in Dallas and halted Robert Martinez in the third round, and then suffered an accident in which he chipped a bone in his knee and required surgery.

The undercard, assembled by matchmake Mel Greb, matches undeteated super bantamweight Joe Rincones of Long Beach, Calif., against veteran Hector Diaz of Mexico in an eight-rounder, unbeaten Las Veags middleweight Kevin Grantham against Otis Pimpleton of Las Vegas in a six-rounder; undefeated featherweight John Baldwin of Odessa, Texas, against Jerald McNeil of Houston in a four-rounder; and unbeaten welterweight Tony Robinson of Detroit in a six-rounder against an opponent to be selected.

Rincones has a record of 9-0 with eight knockouts and is in his toughest test to date against the more experienced Diaz, with a mark of 24-9 and 11 knockouts.

Grantham has a record of 6-0-1 with three knockouts and is coming off a win over Vince Wilkerson on Sept. 10 at the Showboat. Pimpleton has a record of 4-3-1 with one knockout.

Baldwin has a record of -0 with two knockouts while McNeil has a mark of 2-2

Robinson, from the Kronk stable which includes fourtime world champion Thomas Hearns, has a record of 1-0 with one knockout.
