(NBC, USA) organization which was conventing at the same time in Fort Worth, Texas, to Dallas where NBC was holding its 87th annual convention. There they mingled joyously with the more than 40,000 attending the Dallas meet

It was an emotionally charged scene with T. J. Jemison, president of the National Baptist Convention and E. Edward Jones, president of the "rival" NBC-USA jointly leading the procession up the center aisle, as thousands applauded. Many broke down and wept openly. Dr. Jones declared: 'There are millions of hungry people (in the nation and the world); dope is on the rise and we must do something about it." Dr. Jemison responded: "We are going to work together (to end poverty) and help make Black people independent."

The secretaries of the two conventions, the Rev. Samuel E. Wright, of Dallas, of NBC-USA, and NBC's the Rev. W. Franklyn Richardson, of Mt. Vernon, N.Y., presided. Dr. Jemson and Dr. Jones made their opening statements, linked arm-inarm. Both men are natives of Louisiana.

Robbie Crump-McCoy,

NBC publicist, told NNPA that "only a few knew that this coming together had been in the making since 1985." The original convention split in two more than seven decades ago over a property dispute.

NAACP Executive Director Benjamin L. Hooks, Ralph Abernathy, of the Southern CHristian Leadership Conference; the Rev. Allan Boesak, of South Africa, president of the World Alliance of Reformed Churches: Comedian/ nutritionist Dick Gregory and the Rev. Jesse L. Jackson, voiced strong approval of the long-awaited coming together celebration of the two powerful Baptist conventions. Dallas Mayor Annette Strauss called it a "special occasion."

Introduced to a standing ovation, Dr. Boesak declared: "This is an historic occasion. It proves that greater issues can unite while lesser ones divide. Voting is your power. Use it. (Blacks in South Africa cannot vote). Rights are given by God, not by governments; but remember that you in the USA will never be free until we in South Africa are free. This binds us together."

Dr. Jemison announced that \$25,000 was given Dr. Boesak by the Conventions to help in his work for human

and civil rights in South Africa. The Conventions also gave Dr. Hooks \$50,000 to help carry on the work of the NAACP. Both presidential candidates — George Bush and Michael Dukakis - were invited to address the huge convention. Only Dukakis put in an appearance, prompting Dr. Jemison to remark at a news conference: "It's hard to do something about racism in America when it's sanctioned from the White House.

NBC's Dr. Mary O. Ross, whose Woman's Convention Auxiliary also met in Dallas reported that \$50,000 of a \$100,000 pledge to help build the \$12 million Baptist World Center in Nashville. next June, had already been donated. NBC also expressed sorrow over the August closing of Bishop College which had an estimated \$20 million
