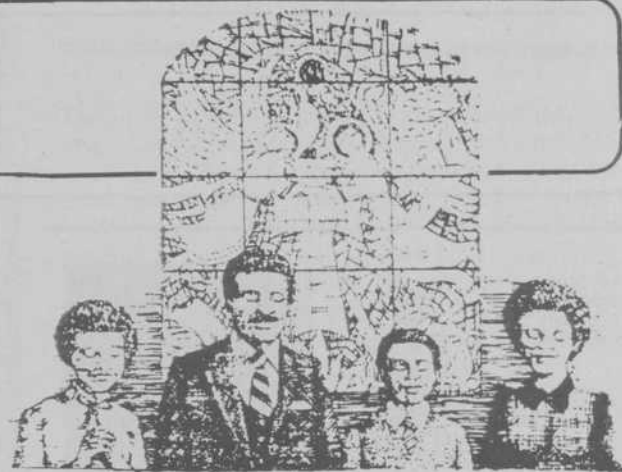

The Jackson Southernaires In Concert January 13 at Zion Methodist Church

Rev. Sam Roberson and Combach Choir Also Featured

Throughout the United States, the Jackson Southernaires have become one of America's most outstanding all around beloved singing groups.

The group, composed of Luther Jennings, Huey Williams, Frank Williams, Paul Peters, Brian Williams, Haran Griffin, and Roger Bryant, got together in the mid 60's. During this time, the group signed with Duke/Peacock Records of Houston, Texas. Their first recording, "Too Late", became one of the company's biggest single and album sellers. In 1973 and 1974, they recorded two albums for ABC records and both were ranked among the top ten listing.

In 1976 the Jackson Southernaires signed with Malaco Records of Jackson, Mississippi. They are currently the No. 1 gospel group in Mississippi and is ranked among the top ten gospel groups both nationally and internationally. They

sold well over 100,000 LP's last year and own their own record label, publishing and production company headed by Frank Williams. The Jackson Southernaires were the first to start gospel at Malaco Records, Inc., and they are the producers of such outstanding groups as: the Sensational Nightingales, J.J. Farley and the Original Soul Stirrers, the Williams Family, the Dixons, the Truthettes, the D.R. Curry Memorial Choir, the Evereadys, the Angelic Gospel Singers, and the Fantastic Violinaires.

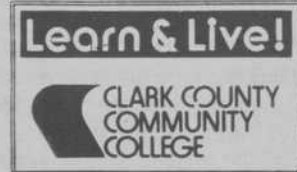
