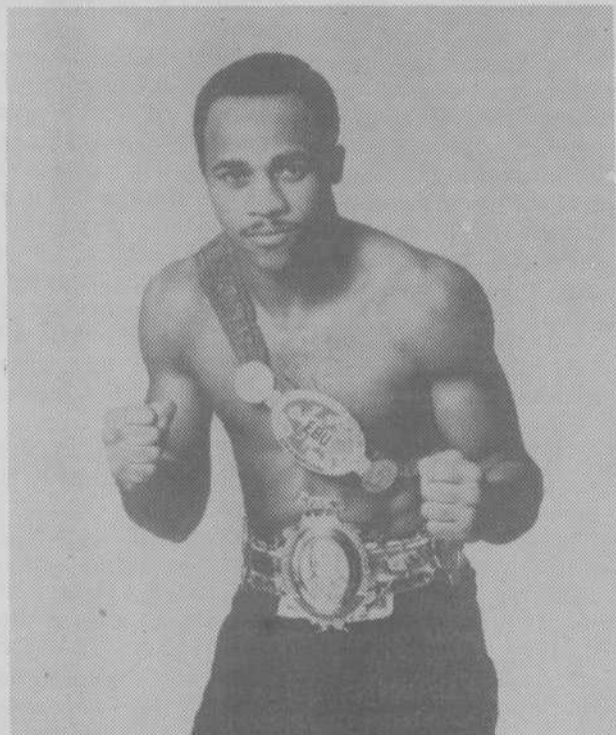
## NIGHT OF THE WELTERWEIGHTS AT CAESARS PALACE

The four top welterweights in the world will be paired off to decide the World Boxing Association and World Boxing Council welterweight championships in the Caesars Palace Indoor Sports Pavilion on Saturday, Feb. 4.

The fights, featuring defending WBC champion Lloyd Honeyghan against former WBA title holder Marlon Starling, and former WBA champion Mark Breland against number two contender Seung-Soon Lee, will begin at 5:30 p.m. PST with doors opening at 4:30 p.m.

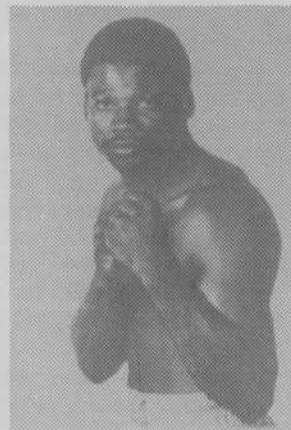
Honeyghan, 33-1 with 22 KOs, who took back the WBC title last March from Jorge Vaca, will go against Starling, 43-5-1 with 26 KOs, who held the WBA title for 11 months before losing it to

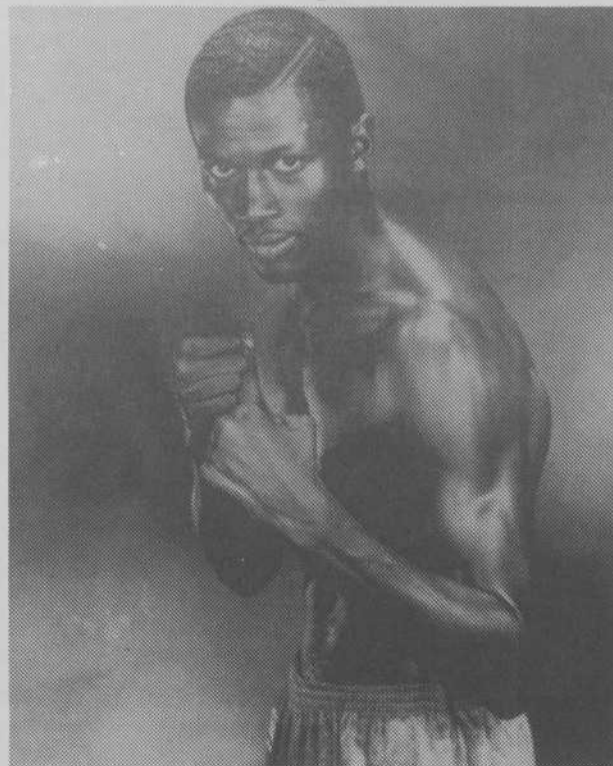

## YET ANOTHER TICKET CATEGORY—\$850—SOLD OUT FOR TYSON-BRUNO WORLD TITLE CARD FEB. 25

Tickets in the fourth of seven price categories—this one costing \$850—are sold out for the Mike Tyson-Frank Bruno world heavyweight championship card Feb. 25 at the Las Vegas Hilton.

Earlier tickets in the \$100, \$300 and \$900 ringside price ranges sold out for this internationally significant, multi-million dollar event.

However, tickets still remain on sale in three price categories—\$400, \$650 and \$750.

The site of the Tyson-Bruno title fight card will be the 9860-seat indoor Hilton Center.

Tickets in those three remaining price ranges are on sale from 9 a.m. to 5 p.m. (PST) seven days a week at the Las Vegas Hilton Tickets

and Tours Booth located in the hotel lobby area.

Tickets may be ordered from 9 a.m. to 5 p.m. seven days a week by calling (702) 732-5320 or 1-800-222-5361.

Tickets also are available from Ticketron and Teletron outlets throughout the United States.

The unbeaten Tyson, who has a record of 53-0 with 31 knockouts, is fighting for the first time in eight months, by far the longest layoff of his career. This will be his first appearance in Las Vegas in 20 months and his fifth defense of his undisputed world championship.

Bruno, ranked No. 1 by both the World Boxing Association and the World Boxing Council, has a record of 32-2 with 31 knockouts.
