Motor homes represent a natural focal point for many forms of outdoor recreation and are now in ever increasing popularity. A survey conducted by Michigan State University indicates a 100 percent increase in motor home rentals since 1980.

They are agents for private motor home owners, small motor home rental companies, and renters. While Bates does not guarantee specific projected rental income, they do provide all services relating to the rental, scheduling, written contractural agreements, money handling, and transaction settlement on a per rental basis. For these important services a commission of 25 to 40 percent is earned.

During 1987, Bates rental income increased 50 percent from the previous year. Contributing to this increase were expanded marketing efforts during late 1987 and throughout 1988.

Bates' main objectives are: to generate more interest in motor home rentals, to fulfill all rental requests and to recruit new motor home owners into their network.
