Streetwise Alive Youth Organization Outlines Goals

The "Street-Wise Alive" Youth Organization, pointin gout that Las Vegas youth have very little to do in the way of wholesome and constructive entertainment, plans to fill that void.

Among the goals for the organization are listed: 1) Organizing the youth around constructive entertainment outlets; 2) Bringing the adult and business com-

munity closer to our young people; 3) Opening constructive avenues of opportunity to all youth, for the expression of the God given talent that they have been blessed with; 4) Raising the awareness and understanding of Crime/drug world in the community, to such a high level that none will be able to say "I didn't know;" and 5) Opening real lines of com-

munication between adults and youth.

The youth organization feels it has a real plan to help stop drugs and gangs in the community.

The first community-wide program that the "Street-Wise Alive group plans to emplement will be a Youth Fashion Design Contest. The contest, which will be open to all youth under the age of

20, will afford youth the opportunity to design, create and model their own clothes, which will be judged down to the best four in six different categories - men's and women's casual, dressy and sports wear. Included in the project will be an apprentice sewing work shop for the youth, and an apparel shop where the public can buy the tailor made clothes and the

youth can sell what they make.

Varied activities and assemblies are planned for the youth throughout the summer, such as the "Fun in the Park" Day held last Sunday at Freedom Park. In addition, "Street-Wise Alive" sponsors assemblies and concerts where the dangers of drug addiction are presented and discussed in a

manner that promotes increased awareness and understanding of those dangers.

The "Streetwise Alive" Program is headed by Mr. Lawrence T., a former drug user and trafficker, who uses his own experiences to teach youth about the problems which are inherent in the use of drugs.

Not failure, but low aim, is a sin."


