Slick Rick, De La Soul, Too \$hort at T&M July 26

When the Nitro Tour hits the stage at Thomas and Mack Center, UNLV next Wednesday night, July 26, other featured guests along with LL Cool J will be Slick Rick, De La Soul and Too Short.

All About Slick Rick

One of the most audacious debuts in the history of rap was made in the summer of 1985 by a young man billed as MC Ricky D and dubbed Slick Rick by his partner, Doug e. Fresh. The two were teamed up on the 12-inch single, "The Show" b/w "La-Di-Da-Di" (Reality Records).

"The Show" was a huge radio smash largely devoted to Doug's "human beat box" shenanigans, although it did include a brief rhyme from someone who sounded like an aristocratic English gentleman, beefing about an attempt to pick up a girl on the D-Train, then getting mistaken by her for a bowl of frosted flakes.

"La-Di-Da-Di" was even deffer but, because its lyrics were too raw for radio, success was confined to the street where, naturally, every young black kid in America felt duty-bound to learn it word-for-word. Essentially, "La-Di-Da-Di" was the first great adventure for Slick Rick. Over the most low-tech of accompaniments (Doug provided all the beats; there were no instruments) Rick told a long, lazy story about waking up in the morning, bathing, brushing his teeth, getting dressed and hitting the street. There he runs into "Sally From the Valley.'' The two of them proceed to bump into her mother, who "slams the child on the hard concrete,' and then makes a play for Rick! The side was remarkable for its detail, humor, cinematic clarity and movement, and freedom of expression.

Even more amazing was Rick's next trick, a disappearing act that lasted for three years. But now, as the young man himself notes on The Great Adventures Of Slick Rick, his brand new album for Jam/Columbia, "The Ruler's Back"...and none the worse for the passage of time. Indeed, if the new LP demonstrates anything, it's that none of the artists who've emerged in his absence can touch the original.

The truth is that Rick is as much a writer as a comedian as he is a rapper, with the

nearest analogies to Great Adventures being Henry Miller's Tropic OF Cancer and Richard Pryor's That Nigger's Crazy -- although old-time rock 'n rollers may also find Rick's down home understanding of the bloody battle of the sexes reminiscent of Jimmy Soul's

'If You Wanna Be Happy. Now 23 years old, Ricky Walters was born to Jamaican parents in South Wimbledon, London and raised in England for most of his first 14 years -- which explains his posh accent. He grew up listening to "hard reggae," and got into rap as an art major at New York's High School of Music & Art. It was there he formed the Kangol Crew, a 7-member posse (including two co-eds) in which he and future rap star Dana Dane were featured. He graduated in 83 and hooked up with Doug E. Fresh a year or so later, after defeating the legendary Cold Crush Brothers in a rap contest in the Bronx.

Rick still lives in the North Bronx where he recorded most of Great Adventures in his basement studio with his homeboy, DJ Vance Wright, his partner since tenth grade.

As far as where he's been the last three years, the mysterious Mr. Slick Rick will only say: "I took a nice long vacation 'cause I knew the next time out there'd be no turning back."
